It was the height of the summer, late July 1963, and something was killing the chickens. It crept unto the brooder house in the wee hours between nightfall and dawn and took the laving hens a few at a time. There were no tracks, but the predator was slipping in from the outside from someplace Dad hadn't discovered yet.

It was a sad day to find our hens dead. On a farm you come face-to-face with realities of nature, more often the life and death daily struggles that animals face. One little mistake can have big consequences. You check and re-check chicken coups and chicken houses for gaps in the wire, and cracks or holes in the walls. Sometimes a predator can squeeze under the bottom run of boards around the chicken house

to remove manure from the brooder house. Here is where the hens, White Leghorns, Rhode Island Reds, and Golden Comets gathered to eat, drink, socialize, and lay their eggs.

The predator was determined and crafty; and apparently hungry. It had come nearly every night for close to a week. It had begun by killing a few hens that were careless enough to move outside at dawn, before daylight, before the nocturnal predators retreated to their

At first we thought it was an owl, because of the way the heads were ripped off. The chickens were free-range and could move around at will, leaving them susceptible to a silent, diving attack from the air. Chickens can fly, but very slowly; they can run faster but not fast enough to escape an attack from the sky. The killing continued and when the manner of it changed beyond decapitation we begin to suspect raccoons.

We knew raccoons were scavengers and not killers but what could it be? Every morning at daybreak en down, it returned. we would go to the brooder house and find more dead hens. We had never had such a problem in all the years we had been raising chickens.

The next step was to try and trap the predator. Dad borrowed two traps from a friend that would kill the animal instantly and two leg-hold traps and placed chain contraption designed them carefully at the ani-



mal's most likely points of entry. But the animal was too clever, and either ignored the traps or set them off without being caught.

Next we checked every entrance and exit, and every nook and cranny that could be sealed was sealed. Nothwhile that seemed to work, but when the traps were tak-

From early July through the end of the first week of August that year, the predator had killed 15 laying hens. This was a significant loss for a small time farmer and difficult to recoup. And we still didn't know what IT was . . .

Then one day, it left tracks. At the entrance to the henhouse, if you bend down and looked closely, you could see blurred animal prints left behind in the wet dirt. More telling,

there was the distinctive, unmistakable impression of a raccoon's paw. I've read that a raccoon can flatten themselves out to less than three inches thick in order to shimmy under a chicken house.


Then one night we heard ing could get in or out. For a a loud flopping noise; like something hitting against the wall . . . something was in the trap; Dad jumped up, grabbed his shotgun and rushed to the brooder house. There was the predator caught in the trap!
