Fred Brown is no stranger to farming. His family has been in the farming business since the late 1880's. He helped around the farm when he was growing up and graduated from the University of Kentucky with a degree in animal science and a minor in ag economics.

The Browns have a farm of approximately 500 acres that they maintain year around. He said that they raise and slaughter between 900 to 1000 hogs every year which is the reason for their newest venture, Brown Farm Meats.

Brown said that all his animals are corn fed and when he takes them to Bardstown to be butchered, there are no additives or chemicals added to the meats. Each item is USDA approved and vacuum sealed to maintain the fresh quality of the meats.

Estill Co. Co-Ed Softball Church League


