Councilman Louis Officer said that considering that there were no new business opening up in the city to collect taxes from and the wet/dry vote didn't pass then the city was going to have to find other ways to pay off the loans. He said he would be willing to give up his monthly pay if it would help the city.

Newly elected councilmember Amy Crowe stated that she wasn't willing to give up her pay because it helped her pay her house payment each month.

The council agreed to consolidate the three loans into one at Citizen's Guaranty Bank and to make the monthly payment of \$300 on the loan and pay any extra on it that they could each month.

Another hot topic of discussion was the garbage situation throughout the city. Mayor Estine Tipton stated that there was too much extra garbage being picked up in the city. She said that in previous years Mayor Crowe allowed two free pickups per year that the city paid for, and that it was where a lot of the money was going.

She said that every load that is hauled to the dump by city workers costs the city around \$25, not including the gas that is spent on the trip there and back. She said that she felt like homeowners should have to pay for the city to remove unwanted mattresses and couches from their property.

Jim Richardson agreed and said that those unwanted items should be disposed of by the homeowner and not the city.

William VanCleve suggested asking Terry Barnes, who is in charge of the regular garbage route in Ravenna, what he would charge to haul off those unwanted items for the city.

Mayor Tipton said that Barnes' contract with the city is added onto the water bills each month and he is only required to take garbage that are in bags each week.

The council voted to charge \$25 per load of garbage for residents in the city for all extra garbage removal. Mayor Tipton stressed the fact that if a homeowner called to have garbage removed and it took three trips to the dump to dispose of it, then they would be charged for each load that was hauled away.
