

Engineers Beat Owls; Lady Engineers Fall To Lady Owls In Two OT's

Both Estill basketball teams were back in action on Friday night in a doubleheader at Owsley County after a couple of cancellations.

The Engineers won 36-32 in a slow, highly defensive contest while the Lady Engineers came from behind to tie in regulation before losing in double-overtime, 63-60.

Estill's girls trailed early against the Lady Owls but came back to lead much of the latter part of regulation. However, Owsley took the lead and were in the driver's seat for the win with a 52-50 advantage with seconds to go.

But the Lady Engineers high-scoring junior Kennedy Flynn was fouled on a 3-point-attempt and hit two

of three fta's with only .2 seconds to go, forcing the first overtime.

Estill had a good chance to win in the second overtime and led by two with 30 seconds to go when Flynn fouled out. The Owls hit at the buzzer to tie at 57-all.

The Lady Engineers played well without Flynn in double OT but the Lady Owls managed to scratch out the three-point victory.

The Engineers were in action at home on Tuesday night after press time against Mercer County. They will play at home again on Friday night against Jackson City, and both the Estill girls and boys will be playing on Saturday, January 18th in a double-header at Powell County.
