Lindon said Estill County was alloted \$1,161,623 during the fiscal year beginning July 1. He said this allotment was down from last year's because of a decrease in the gas tax on January 1.

He said this means that Estill County's allotment is about \$15,000 less than last year's.

The county will receive \$155,928, or 15%, on July 1 for county roads. Another 3,862 goes into the judge executive's fund.

Just over a half million, \$502,600, is reserved for road maintenance, such as snow removal, mowing, and ditching.
