StrikeForce Initiative Expands Into Kentucky

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack hear and Congressman Hal Rogers to announce the expansion of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Strike-Force Initiative into four additional states: Kentucky, Louisiana, Tennessee and West Virginia.

"The StrikeForce strategy of partnering public resources with local expertise is helping to grow rural economies and create jobs in persistent poverty communities," said Vilsack. "This is a strategy that is working in rural America and I am pleased that we continue to build on these efforts to bring assistance to areas that need it the most."

Since 2010, through StrikeForce, USDA has partnered with over 400 community organizations, businesses, foundations, universities and other groups to support 80,300 projects and ushered more than \$9.7 billion in investments into rural America, includ-

• In fiscal year (FY) 2013, the Farm dents." joined Kentucky Governor Steve Bes-Service Agency provided nearly \$9.3 million to fund microloans in Strike-Force areas. Approximately 84 percent of the loans were provided to socially disadvantaged and beginning farmers.

> • Last year, the number of landowners applying for Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) programs in StrikeForce areas increased by 82 percent over the previous year.

• In FY 2013, the Rural Housing Community Facilities Program obligated a total of \$68 million to fund hospitals, libraries and other projects in StrikeForce areas—a 4.5 percent increase over 2012.

• Between 2012 and 2013, the Food Vilsack also noted that the Strike- and Nutrition Service doubled the redemption of SNAP benefits at farmers markets from \$2 million to over \$4 million in StrikeForce states—a more than 100 percent increase.

 In 2012, USDA's Food and Nutrition Service increased the number of istration's commitment to addressing children in StrikeForce states receiving free or reduced price school breakfasts by 7.4 percent.

This expansion brings StrikeForce attention to more than 700 rural counties, parishes, boroughs, tribal reservations, and Colonias in 20 states, including Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia and West Virginia.

USDA identifies census tracts with over 20 percent poverty (according to American Community Survey data) to identify sub-county pockets of poverty. As areas of persistent poverty are identified, USDA staff work with state, local and community officials to increase awareness of USDA programs and help build program participation through intensive community

StrikeForce is part of the Adminpersistent poverty across America. Last week, President Obama announced the first five of twenty Promise Zones, including one in southeastern Kentucky, that target federal resources to cities, rural areas and Tribal communities suffering the worst poverty.



> After a couple weeks under black plastic, the soil will have warmed a few degrees, and you can prepare the bed for planting and transplanting. Once planted, you should install a wooden or metal frame over the bed and cover it with clear polyethylene film. Anchor the film at the base with boards, bricks or soil, but remember that occasionally you will have to remove the poly to tend to the plants and to harvest the

For this reason, it's best if you don't permanently attach the plastic to the frame. It will also be necessary to open sections of the covering for ventilation on warm sunny days. You can easily accomplish this by designing the ends of the covering so you can easily open or remove them during warm weather.


