Burdens of The Cross

In 1 Corinthians 1:17-18 Paul wrote: "For Christ sent me not to baptize, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of none effect. For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." He also wrote in **Romans 1:16** saying: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto (toward) salvation." So then, in these verses we find that the gospel reveals the life, the purpose, and the sacrifice that was made by Christ to save us from our sins.

I hope we all understand that the cross was an instrument of cruel torture used by the Romans to inflict the most agonizing power upon thieves, murderers, and runaway slaves. So again, we see by these acts what they really thought of Christ who had committed no sin at all. **Revelation 1** tells us that they will get what is due them at the return of Jesus. Sadly, Christ stood alone on Pilate's judgment hall, yet He was not alone, for the Father was with Him knowing it all. Some times when Christians stand for all of Christ's truths they may feel as though they too are alone, but in reality they also know that the Lord is with them every moment. Sadly, we as christians who use the scriptures as they were written find ourselves in conflict with the secular religious world who violate basic bible teachings. Being in conflict Christians will suffer the burdens of this cross also. They may come in open ridicule, slander, name callings, rejection, but all who follow Christ need to understand that this happened to our Lord, and it will also happen to them. In Matthew 10:24-25 Jesus says: "The servant is not greater than his master." He goes onto say: "If they have called the master of the house Beelzebub (Son of Satan), how much more shall they call them of his household?" So again, as a Christian in fact, we need to realize right up front that we are different from the religious world and because of it will be slandered by many.
