The Estill County Grand prison. Jury indicted six individuals in four separate burglaries in charges Eric Brooks with Estill County.

Craig E. Johnson, 32, of a misdemeanor. Chamberlain Branch, Irvine and James Hunter Yates, 30, of Lilly Ferry Road, Irvine were named as co-defendants in a first degree burglary at second degree burglary at the the home of Dwayne Travis on May 7, 2014.

The indictment states the two entered Travis' home to commit a crime. The indictment says that when leaving the home, they were armed with a deadly weapon, making the offense first degree.

First degree burglary is a class B felony, punishable by ten to twenty years in state glary. prison.
