

QB Trevor Jones Signs With Morehead Eagles

Estill County Engineers' quarterback Trevor Jones signed on national signing day, Wednesday, February 4, 2015, to play for the Morehead State University Eagles.

Jones, son of Estill Coach Mike Jones and Tiffany Jones, played most of four years on Estill's varsity. He is also an outstanding member of Estill's basketball team.

Trevor said his most memorable moment at Estill was beating Powell County 62-6 this year.

Jones has loved football as long as anyone remembers. Coach Jones said when Trevor was a toddler he watched football on television intently. In later years he was known to have carried a football around with him. He was also one of the kids as an elementary and middle school student who wanted to get to close to the sidelines at Estill High games.

Coach Jones praised his son for the work he did, saying Trevor set goals, and worked and played hard to achieve them.

Athletic director Arthur Ballard called Trevor "the best athlete who played at Estill." Ballard said he previously thought Robbie Wiseman was the best ever, but now thinks Trevor is the best.

Trevor said he really liked MSU's head coach, Rob Tenyer, and will be playing for him as a slot receiver, rather than quarterback as he played for much of his high school years. "Their offense is perfect for me," said Jones.

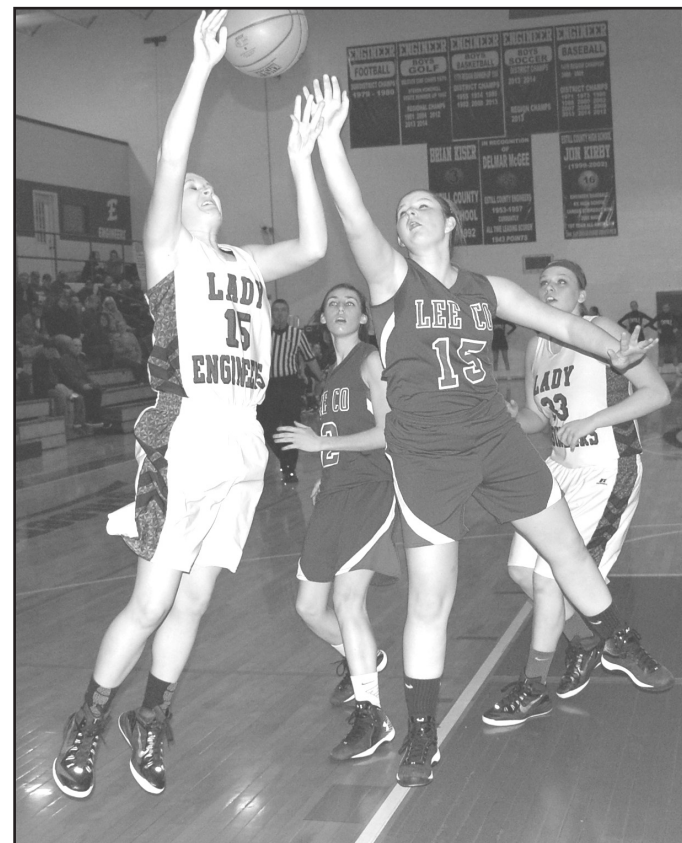
Cade had 45 punts in the 2014 season for the KSU Thoroughbreds for 1,488 yards with an average of 33.07. His longest was 59 yards. He had six field goals and kicked 23 extra points for 41 total, the second highest point total for KSU. They finished the season 3-7.

The Kohl Camp is open to only draft eligible and free agent kickers, punters, and snappers. This camp was developed as a way to help our top Elite Campers and January qualifiers separate themselves from other prospects trying to make the NFL. Organizers feel this event will help many people
