

Police Activity Log

An Irvine man was arrested by Irvine Police on February 17 on assault charges out of Madison County.

Officer Karl Rifembark served the arrest warrant on Nathan McIntosh, 60, of North Madison Avenue, Irvine.

The arrest warrant was signed by Madison Judge Charles Hardin.

It states that in November of last year, McIntosh intentionally caused injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument.

The victim, Jason Friend, said that he and McIntosh were involved in a verbal argument inside McIntosh's vehicle. Friend allegedly left the vehicle but stated that he was followed by McIntosh.

The warrant states that McIntosh began to chase Friend around the car while McIntosh was holding a knife in his hand.

Friend said he put his

hands up in an attempt to defend himself, but he was severely lacerated on his hand. Friend was treated for a laceration and released from Baptist Health. He received approximately 20 stitches.

Assault second degree is a felony.

An Estill bench warrant was also served on McIntosh. The local warrant was signed by District Judge William Leach, because McIntosh failed to appear for an arraignment and pay a \$30 service fee. Local charges are not stated.

That warrant says McIntosh was to be held without bail.

Woman arrested at hospital

A Beattyville woman was arrested Sunday night for being intoxicated at Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital.

Irvine Officer John Sturmiolo said that Chrl Baker, 44, had a strong odor of alcohol on her person. She reportedly told the officer that

she had drank several shots before coming to the hospital.

Sturmiolo administered field sobriety tests, which he said Baker failed.

The officer said that Baker kept raising her voice and yelling. He said there were other people in the area, and this caused alarm to them.

In addition to alcohol intoxication, he charged Baker with disorderly conduct.

Tires are stolen

The thefts of two sets of tires were reported by James Noland of Wisemantown Road to the Estill County Sheriff's Department.

Deputy Randy Farthing is investigating the thefts.

The deputy said that on February 6 and February 10 of this year was when the tires were stolen.

He said that tires were stolen and rolled up a hill. They were then thrown over a guardrail.

Ray McIntosh Jr. of Richmond was arrested on February 14 by Deputy Farthing on charges of theft by unlawful taking/disposition/shoplifting.

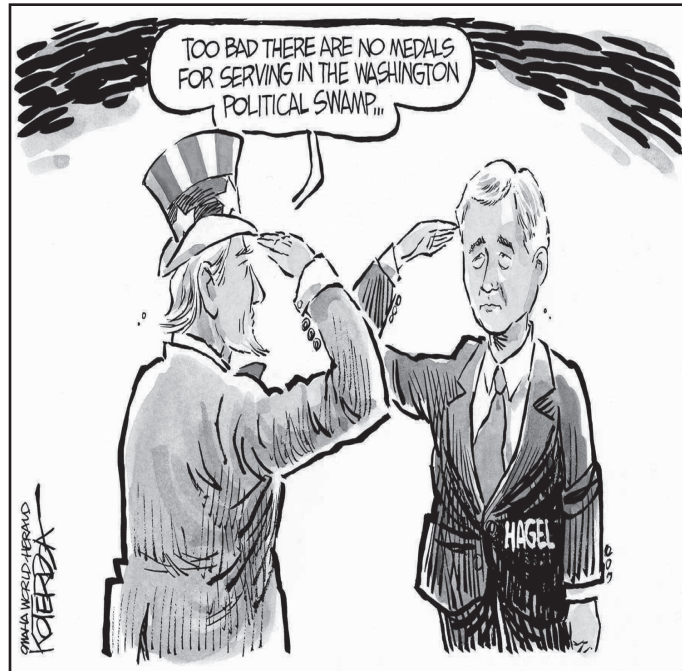
According to the citation, McIntosh had taken three knives at Pickers Paradise. The knives were recovered.
