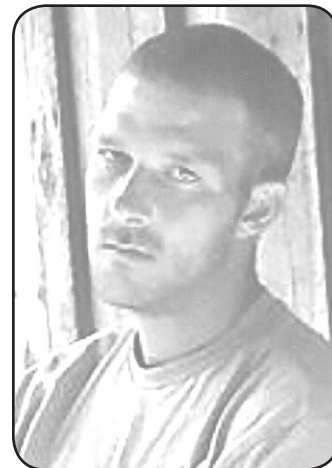
Kalien Luke Moore, 31

Where are the dead, and does man have a soul that will live after earthly death?

Time and space prevent me from making a long lesson on these important subjects but I will try to give you enough scriptures hoping that you currently will be awakened at the least.

Where are the dead? Does the Bible teach that there is an eternal abode of the soul? This should be a challenge in the minds of all who are concerned about eternity. Andrew Carnegie offered a reward of \$1,000,000 to anyone who could prove to his satisfaction the reality of life beyond the grave. This question cannot be answered until we have crossed over the river of death. But then one may say: "but where are the answers? Can science of philosophy give the answers?" Even the most studied scientists cannot tell any one anything beyond the grave. Poor, weak, mortal men could never reason an answer to the question.

But there is hope, because within the word of God, the Creator not only reveals the origin of man, but also informs us of our soul and its destiny. Even though God formed man out of dirt and breathed into him the breathe of life, and in so doing man became a living soul. Some preferred religionists deny that man has a soul. **So where are the dead? Ecclesiastes 12:7**, "shall the dust (man) return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it." So then when one dies this body returns to the earth and but the living soul is placed by the Lord into a place with two compartments called Hades (death), and there they will remain unto our Lord calls them forth to be eternally judged.

Within the narrative of the rich man and Lazarus of **Luke 16:18-31** is evidence beyond doubt of the consciousness of the soul after death. Here the rich man who died physically could hear, talk, think, speak, and suffer pain. In the passage of **Matthew 17:6-9** here the apostles saw and heard speak Moses, Elijah, and God, long after Moses and Elijah had left the earth. So death is not annihilation of man, but really just a beginning. Do we really know why men deny that there is a soul? If there was not a living soul, then man would have no fear of death, since he would also believe that there would be no judgment, thereby no punishment in a lake of fire, but friend, there are both of these things to come.

Paul wrote in **II Thessalonians 1:7-10**, "When the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power; When he shall come to be glorified in his saints, and to be admired in all them that believe (because our testimony among you was believed) in that day." In **John 5:28-29**, and also in **Revelation 20:10-15**, is told of the day when all the dead will come forth and of the place they are at this time to stand before he Lord to be eternally judged. Some will go on into eternal life, but sadly the majority will go into eternal damnation (**Matthew 7:13-14**). You will make the choice here in this life concerning where you will go.
