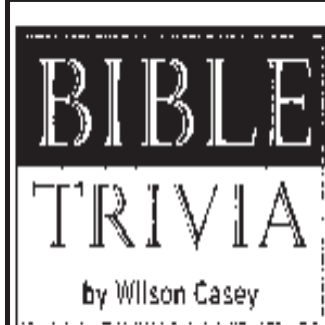
Old man Winter has finally left (hopefully!!) I don't know about you all, but I am greatly enjoying this warmer weather. And if you're like me, staying inside of the house to clean is very hard to do with these beautiful days; however, it must be done I suppose (I usually wait for a rainy day). Since spring cleaning is getting underway, now is a good time to take inventory and make plans to go green for your annual spring cleaning! One way to do this is to use homemade cleaning

products or by purchasing green household cleaning products. Green cleaning products are safer for humans and provide added benefits for the environment. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, air in our homes typically is more polluted than outside air, with one of the largest pollutants being household cleaners. Whenever I clean with commercial household cleaners I most always end up with a headache due to their strong chemical smell. The use of green cleaning products, however, can improve residential air quality and give you less of a headache if you're like me. These products are safe to use, non-toxic and clean just as well as products that contain hazardous chemicals. You can find green cleaning products for everything from glass to laundry. Many products are biodegradable for easy disposal and are packaged in recycled containers. These products are often a

little bit more expensive, but they are so much better for our health and the environment! In most cases, you can determine if a product is green by reading its label. Look at the list of ingredients to see if the product contains any potentially harmful chemicals such as chlorine or peroxide-based bleach, ammonia, turpentine and lye. If a product claims to "kills germs" or "disinfect", look for its EPA registration number on the label. The green products you buy may be costlier so if you can't or don't want to spend money on those products you can still use green cleaning products by making your own! And most of the ingredients needed are already available in your kitchen cupboard, such as white vinegar, baking soda, and lemon juice! Here are just a couple of recipes for green cleaning products: Glass Cleaner: Mix ¼ cup ammonia, 2 tablespoons white vinegar and 1cup of

water. Air Freshener: Place an open box of baking soda in the refrigerator and freezer or sprinkle into garbage cans. To learn more recipes and to learn more information about going green, come join me at the Estill County Extension Office on April 22nd, 2015 at 6:00pm and I'll go over what it means to be green and give tips on how to do that. It's an important thing to learn because it's not only great for the environment, but it can also be great for your wallet! I will also be giving away free recycling bins to everyone who attends and giving more information about recycling in our community. I hope to see you all there! Mountain Mushroom Festival Parade

One of the Mountain Mushroom Festival crowd's favorite event is the parade. The theme for 2015 is "Mountain Mushroom Festival's 25th Anniversary." It will be Sat., April 25, beginning at 1 p.m. with the line-up at 11:45 a.m. behind Estill Springs School, 314 Main St., Irvine. Judging will begin promptly at noon. The parade will proceed up Court Street onto Broadway

and end in Ravenna. Civic organizations, churches, fire departments, and school clubs are invited to participate in the parade by entering antique vehicles, bands, marching units, and floats. All-terrain vehicles are prohibited from the parade, except for those used as part of a float. For safety reasons, no animals, bicycles or unlicensed motorized ve-

hicles will be entered. The entry fee for a float is \$10 April 17 or before and \$20 from April 20-25. Floats will be judged on creativity, originality, and beauty. Also 10 extra points will be given if mushrooms are used on the float. Cash prizes will be given for the top three winners of the floats. The prizes in the float category are \$175 for first prize, \$125 for sec-

ond prize, and \$75 for third prize. Parade participants will not be allowed to toss candy or other objects to the crowd in the interest of safety of the community. Candy can be handed out.
