Indiana Fugitive arrested in Irvine

A fugitive from Indiana who has been living in Madison County man was arrested in Irvine on Thursday by state police.

Trooper C. Royal made a traffic stop on S. Hudson Avenue, in which the fugitive was a passenger.

The trooper wrote in the citation the operator of the vehicle gave him permission to search the vehicle and its con-

During the search, the trooper reported that he found a brown powder substance inside a candy container. The container was inside a purse in the front seat of the vehi-

Trooper Royal said the passenger told him multiple times, it was heroin in the container and it belonged to him.

A field test on the powder tested positive for heroin. Trooper Royal charged Jonathan Black, 23, with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first of-

Bail on this charge has been set at \$25,000 cash.

During the investigation, the trooper discovered there was an active warrant for Black's arrest from Wayne County, Indiana. He is wanted there on a charge of possession of a narcotic drug.

The citation states that Indiana plans to extradite Black

Trooper Royal then charged Black with being a fugitive from another state.
