1. Entries will be received on Tuesday, July 16 between 1:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M.
2. An exhibitor is limited to only one (1) entry per class.
3. The show is open to amateur growers (men, women and children) and flower arrangers who are residents of Estill County.
4. All specimen entries must have been grown by the exhibitor.
5. Flowers used in arrangements and composition need not be grown by exhibitor, but must be the original work of the exhibitor.
6. Any potted plants must have been grown by owner at least three months.
7. All containers must be furnished by the exhibitor and the fair board will not be responsible for loss or damage to containers. Exhibitors should affix name with adhesive tape to bottom side of containers to insure against loss.
8. A specimen is a single plant bloom, spike or spray with foliage and must be displayed in a small glass bottle (soft drink, catsup or juice bottle suggested). Please note: Gladiolas are top heavy and should be put in a taller \& heavier type bottle or vase.
9. Accessories and mechanics are permitted in arrangements to enhance the design.
10. Flowers must remain on display until Saturday, July 20. Exhibits must be picked up between 9:30 and 11:00 A.M.
11. No one but judges and their assistants will be allowed in the showroom while judging. The decision of the judges is final.
12. A rosette may be given to the specimen, potted plant and arrangement judged to be "Best of Show"at the discretion of the judges.
