

Missing Jackson County man found murdered



Elijah Rader

Kentucky State Police have arrested one man and are looking for two other subjects in connection with

the murder of a Jackson County man who had been missing since late January but was found dead around March 21, 2020.

Elijah Rader, 70 years old of Annville, Kentucky, in Jackson County, was reported missing since January 31, 2020.

As a result of the ongoing investigation, Jessie Gibson, 23 years old of Annville, Kentucky, has been charged with Murder and Kidnaping. He is lodged in the Jackson County Detention Center in McKee.

KSP Post 7 is seeking the public's assistance with locating Bruce Carr, 48 years

old of Manchester, Kentucky, and Melissa Gulley, 35 years old of Richmond, Kentucky. They are being sought for Murder and Kidnaping in connection to the death of Elijah Rader. Carr and Gulley are considered to be armed and dangerous.

Anyone with information is asked to contact local law enforcement or Kentucky State Police, Richmond Post at 859.623.2404.

The Kentucky State Police, Richmond Post began conducting a death investigation following human remains discovered in Jackson County.

The initial investigation

indicates KSP Post 7 was called just after 4:30 p.m., March 21st after a tip was received in reference to possible human remains that were in a rural part of Jackson County.

The Kentucky State Police, Jackson County Sheriff's Office and the Jackson County Emergency Management Agency responded to the area of Old Island City Road. As a result of the search, human remains were located and taken to the State Medical Examiner's Office in Frankfort for an autopsy and identification.

An autopsy was performed and the human re-

mains were identified to be Elijah Rader.

After disappearing in late January, Elijah Rader was reported missing to the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. The Jackson County Sheriff's Office and the Kentucky State Police, Richmond and London Posts have been following up on leads and tips over the past two months. As KSP Detectives continue their investigation into what led to the death of Elijah Rader, more information may be released.

The ongoing investigation is being conducted by KSP Post 7 Detective Ethan Lakes. He was assisted by

KSP personnel, Jackson County Sheriff's Office, Jackson County Emergency Management Agency and the Jackson County Coroner's Office.

Just Hunting by Steve Brewer

This year of 2020 is starting off as my worse year ever. Not only have we lost more money in the stock market than ever before, my trip Gould turkey hunting in Mexico has been cancelled.

Then yesterday, one of our famous chicks just disappeared, without a trace. I also have gone through an emergency surgery, and my wife also had to have an operation. Wow, what a year.

Well, I need to get transition period number three written, before something else bad happens. It is the most important, and the other two would be worthless without this one.

Keep in mind, there is a five-day swing as to the start or end of these transition periods. Tran-

sition period number 3 should start on April 19th and run through May 3rd. This period is similar to the peak of the rut for whitetail deer, which is the best time to hunt.

Afternoon hunting, where allowed, is best at this time. Hens are setting, and gobblers are lonesome, making this the best time to call. The few hens that are available leave the gobblers quickly. Gobblers spend longer times in the tree on the roost with intense gobbling, waiting for the hens to show up before flying down.

Do not, I repeat, do not, call the the gobblers on the roost. Any type of calls will work just fine, during this transition period. Get close on the gobbler on the same level and fire him up with aggressive yelps, purrs, clucks, and cuts. Then wait him out with occasional soft yelps. Listen intently for strutting. Remember gobbling is a bonus, most gobblers strut and drum up their hens.

From mid-morning to mid-afternoon gobblers will respond well to shock calls, such as a crow call, or cutting calls. Odds are in your favor if you hear a gobbler between 9 a.m. 'till 2 p.m., he will come to you. Till next week, get ready, season is upon us.
