## 14th Region "Player of the Year" Joe Benton finishes 3rd on Estill's all-time-scoring list

Estill County's Joe Benton was named 14th Region Player of the Year to go along with a long list of basketball credits in addition to his many feats in golf. He finished with 1,916 points as the third leading scorer in Estill County history behind the legendary Delmar McGee (1,943) and hot-shooting Caleb Bonny (2,448).
