He threw for 1,846 yards and 13 scores in 2018 and rushed for 505 vards and seven touchdowns. He was also a starter on the basketball team and averaged 9.0 points and a team-high 7.8 rebounds per game to help his team finish 26-6 and reach the 12th Region Tournament semifinals.

Somerset blew an 11point lead in the 2019 state title game against Mayfield before rallying to win its first state title in 113 years.


