

The Bible declares in Numbers 32:23 that "your sin will find you out." How true this is within the lives of many. Much ill feelings, disappointments, broken hearts, etc., have been the results of many who attempted to practice deceit. The Bible also says in 1 Timothy 5:24, "Some men's sins are open beforehand, going before to judgment; and some men they follow after." But, either way, one's sins will find you out.

On one occasion, I knew of a story wherein one man and his wife raised together seven children as full brothers and sisters. But after 40 years had passed, two of the older siblings found out through their birth certificates, that each had a different father. So then, can a confession ever make the results of one's past sins disappear? 
