## Indictments returned

Jared Ross, 38, of Beattyville was named as the defendant in a nine-count

Ross' charges include public intoxication of a controlled substance (excludes alcohol), fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot), tampering with physical evidence, drug paraphernalia -- buy/possess, failure of non-owner/ operator to maintain required insurance, second offense, defective steering gear, improper equipment, resisting arrest, and third degree escape.
