

In **Luke 13:22-35**, our Lord was asked this question, "Lord, are there few that be saved?" And then he gave this reply, "Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for be able."

"Will anyone ever enter into Heaven by simply believing in Jesus without ever engaging in the work of attempting to win souls?" This question should cause **2:15** should stimulate our thinking, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, <u>rightly dividing the word of truth</u>." All the study and knowledge of it will never gain one soul for Jesus unless we make applications of it through teaching and preaching; plus, living publicly in its principles. Matthew 5:16 says so!
