## Grand jury returns 30 indictments

Thirty indictments were returned by erating a motor vehicle under the influence, second offense, possession of a controlled substance, second degree, possession of a controlled substance, third degree (drug unspecified), operating on a suspended or revoked operator license, and persistent felony offender, second degree.

> According to the indictment, Abney had fentanyl, 2.108 grams of methamphetamine, suboxone, and three white oval pills. It adds that he threw a small container out of the vehicle window.
