He added by saying that visitors had expected. should be limited inside of the schools and if the numbers started to increase then they would have to look at doing something different.

As of right now school would start on 46, homeless. The warrant was for fail- August 5th with a recommendation for all students to wear masks but they are not required.

> Jeremy Faulkner told the board that furniture was coming in for the area technology center and that the contractors would begin working on the punch list on Monday. He said that everything should be completed by July 23rd when the ribbon cutting ceremony is scheduled.

A pay application was approved for the work that has been completed in the past month in the amount of \$579,992.96.

Peter Fisher said that work on the athletic facility would start soon, and they would begin on the softball and baseball fields. They would then move on to the football field, fieldhouse, tennis courts, and greenhouse. Fisher said
