
FIVE GENERATIONS OF ESTILL COUNTY WOMEN

"As soon as Russell, my PH ask if I wanted to put on a stalk, I immediately said yes, without a second thought. However, he had a buddy with him that kept blocking the shot. After a few minutes they spooked and separated. I was so afraid it was over with.

"Russell came up with plan #2, and we used trenches to go past the animal. We came up on some random piles of sawdust, which was six feet tall or better. "I climbed to the top of the pile, put Russell's backpack under my rifle, and dropped my Blessbok at 290 meters. We would be having Blessbok for dinner that night. I was thrilled, my curse had been broken. Although we both had sawdust in every crevice on our body, in our hair, pockets, shoes, it was extremely worth it. I was so chocked up, I took my inhaler the next time out, it also was full of sawdust. It was the first time ever that either had shot from the dunes."
