

Hospital plans Drive-Up Narcan Training

Mercy Health - Marcum and Wallace Hospital will sponsor a Drive-Up Narcan Training event on Saturday, July 10th from 1-4 p.m. in the lower parking lot at Marcum and Wallace Hospital.

The community is invited to come and meet the Quick Response Team. Other event details include: free Narcan (used

to reverse the lethal effects of opioids), training for family and community members and Substance Use Disorder education and resources.

"We care about our community," said Misty Dehart, Peer Support Specialist at Marcum and Wallace Hospital. "We hope to save lives by offering this free Narcan

and education event. Participants will learn how to recognize and respond to an overdose. We will also answer questions and provide treatment options for those struggling."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the U.S. has seen an increase in overdose deaths during

the COVID-19 pandemic, with 83,544 Americans overdosing during the 12-month period ending July 1, 2020, the most ever recorded in a 12-month period. The increase in drug overdose deaths appeared to begin prior to the COVID-19 health emergency but accelerated significantly during the first months of the pandemic.

According to a 2019 report produced by the Kentucky Office of Drug Control Branch, Estill County had the highest overdose death rate in Kentucky (based on the population adjusted per 100,000 inhabitants) with 11 deaths that were attributed to illicit or prescription drugs.

Other amenities such as parking, pavilions, etc., need to be added on the basis of what works at each particular location and resources. One important supporter of the big idea has been the staff at the Kentucky River Authority which controls the lock and dam properties. Another is David Brown Kinloch who owns/represents Appalachian Hydro Associates. AHP operates the hydro-electric plant at Lock 7 near Shaker Village and is developing other operations upriver. In fact, the plant at Lock 12, near Irvine, has just recently gone operational. He has committed financial resources to make the KRWT real at four of the lock and dam properties.
