Hello Estill County!

My name is Tiffany Reynolds and I'm the new Library Director with the Estill County Public Library. My first day was July 26th and I've spent most this week learning more about my new role as a director, the wonderful library staff, and the community and its people.

Kathy Watson, the outgoing director, showed me around town and introduced me to many people in the community. I cannot wait to meet more of you both inside and outside of the library. I believe that public libraries are a great resource for every individual and I look forward to hearing your ideas of what you would like to see at your public library.

You may want to know a little about my background. My hometown is Breathitt County and is where I currently live. My

first job out of high school was with the Breathitt County Public Library and had many jobs throughout the last few years while I completed my Masters in Library Science and developed my career with public libraries. I lived in Greenville, SC for about 5 years, but it never felt like home. I was ready to come back to Eastern Kentucky, so I accepted a job with the Kentucky Department for Libraries & Archives as a Regional Consultant. During this position, I was able to work with the Estill County Public Library and many others (30 libraries to be exact!) with different projects and meetings.

Bookmobile service is available to for anyone in Estill County, and you must have a Library card. If you don't it is relatively simple to apply for one. You will need to bring in a photo ID, and a recent piece of mail, that has been addressed to you. You will then be asked to complete Library card application paperwork. This information will then be added to our computer database, and at this time you will be issued a Library card.

The Bookmobile serves all of Estill County, and travels all over the county. The Bookmobile is on the road 4 days a week for everyone, with the exception of Friday's which are

reserved for the schools. The Monday thru Thursday schedule is on a 2 week rotation, with each week day having different areas of the county. If you would like to request Bookmobile service, please call the Library at 606-723-3030 and ask to speak with Sherri Jenkins, or you can reach me via Email at info@estillpublib.org. Once you contact me I will add you to the schedule, I will setup a day, and time for your Bookmobile visit.

Now that I have told you all about the Bookmobile, I would like to explain how we are taking care of Bookmobile/Outreach users since COVID-19 has limited our services. The Library also owns a Toyota Matrix, which is being used as of now to make deliveries because of safety concerns due to the Corona Virus. I'm currently making book deliveries to my already established users, and I also deliver to Library users who request home delivery. Patrons call with a list of materials that they want, and then I gather them, check them out, put them in brown paper bags, and deliver them to their front doors. I also pick-up books that are to be returned, and there is no face-to-face contact with anyone. If I do see someone it is

through a glass door. I take every precaution to not spread the Covid-19 virus; I do this by always

wearing gloves, a mask, and sanitizing every book that is brought back to the Library.

Editor's Note: *TICS is the acronym for trafficking in a controlled substance. CS is for a controlled substance. TBUT is for theft by unlawful taking, and RSP is for receiving stolen property.*

Gregory Scott Arvin, dismissed/diverted on possession charge count 2.

Walker J. Harris, dismissed/diverted.

Brenda Neal, dismissed/diverted.

Richard F. Neal, dismissed/diverted.

Tyler Turpin, motion submitted on whether to dismiss/diversion as to extend to Drug Court completed.

Brian Doty, sentencing on 2 counts of false statement/misrepresentation to receive benefits, passed to 8/03.

Jack Cockrell Jr., plea accepted on 1st degree possession of a CS (heroin), first offense, TICS 2nd or greater offense (heroin), possession of a CS, 2nd offense, tampering with physical evidence, and persistent felony offender, 2nd degree. Sentenced to 3 years and 5 years to run concurrently.

Edward Lane Alcorn, plea accepted, sodomy 1st degree, sodomy 3rd degree, unlawful transaction with a minor, 2nd degree, and TICS, 1st degree and 1st offense, judgment to be entered, to register per plea as sex offender.

Joseph Glenn Lambert, KCPC order to enter, status hearing 9/07, 2 counts burglary 1st degree, 2 counts arson first degree, three counts

wanton endangerment first degree, possession of a CS 3rd degree, and public intoxication of a CS (excludes alcohol).

Mickie S. Delucio, PSI report amended, sentencing on August 3, 3 counts TICS 1st offense (less than 2 grams methamphetamine), two counts of TICS 1st offense (greater than or equal to 2 grams methamphetamine), drug paraphernalia -- buy/possess, and tampering with physical evidence.

Kenneth W. Estes, theft by unlawful taking \$500 or more but under \$10,000, pre-trial 9/02 and status 9/07.

Kevin Moes, jury trial remains 8/09, convicted felon in possession of a firearm and fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot).

James Alan Coffey Jr., pre-trial on Sept. 2 and status Sept. 7, 2 counts TICS, second or greater (greater than equal two grams methamphetamine), trafficking in marijuana, less than 8 oz., first offense, 2 counts TICS, 2nd degree and first offense (drug unspecified), convicted felon in possession of a handgun, drug paraphernalia -- buy/possess, and persistent felony offender -- 1st degree.

James Hobbs, judgment to be 1 year for 1 year per plea offer, court to amend judgment, passed to 8/03.

Della L. Maloney, sentenced per plea, TBUT or disposition auto -- \$500 or more but under \$10,000, sentenced per plea, diversion order to enter.

Trenton D. Renfro, pre-trial 10/07 and status 10/22, 2 counts RSP (firearm).

Anthony Kirby, to review bond on possession

of a CS, 1st degree and 1st offense (methamphetamine), drug paraphernalia -- buy/possess, possession of marijuana, and public intoxication controlled substance (excludes alcohol).

Shannon Hardy, jury trial 5/09/22, final pre-trial conference 4/22, convicted felon in possession of a handgun, criminal possession of a forged instrument, 1st degree possession of a CS, 1st degree and 1st offense, and persistent felony offender 2nd degree.

Corey Michael McKinney, assault 4th degree, alcohol intoxication in a public place 2nd offense, and strangulation 1st degree, pre-trial 10/07, status hearing 10/22 and set trial. Motion to revoke bond.

Fred Rogers, 30 days to file pre-trial motions, status hearing 9/07 and set trial, TICS, 1st offense (greater than or equal to 2 grams methamphetamine), theft - receipt of stolen credit/debit card, criminal possession of forged instrument 2nd degree, failure to wear seat belts, and persistent felony offender, 1st degree.

Priscilla Hicks, pre-trial on 10/07 and status 10/22, operating motor vehicle under the influence 1st offense, failure to owner to maintain required insurance 1st, 1st degree possession of CS (heroin) 1st offense, and drug paraphernalia -- buy/possess.

Shannon Hardy, status hearing 4/22/22, RSP \$10,000 or more and persistent felony offender, 1st degree.

Shannon Hardy, status hearing 4/22/22, (2 separate cases with the same charges) 2 counts of prohibited alteration or removal of VIN number,

receiving stolen property \$10,000 or more, and persistent felony offender, 1st degree.

Chris Means, TBUT or disposition - auto \$500 or more but under \$10,000, pre-trial 10/07 and status 10/22.

Cody Ballard, flagrant non-support, pre-trial 10/07 and status 10/22.

Timothy Powell, pre-trial 10/07 and status 10/22, first degree stalking.

James L. Sparks, pre-trial 10/07 and status 10/22, possession of CS 1st degree and 1st offense (methamphetamine).

James Gilvin, \$2,000 bond to be released, plea accepted, judgment and order of probation to be entered, restitution to be paid, operating a motor vehicle under the influence 2nd offense, leaving scene of accident/failure to render aid or assistance, possession of a CS, 1st degree and 1st offense (methamphetamine), possession of marijuana, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, 1st degree possession of CS (drug unspecified), and possession of a CS 2nd degree (drug unspecified).

Leonard Samples, passed to 8/03, theft by deception -- include cold checks under \$10,000, RSP under \$10,000, and persistent felony offender 1st degree.

Both parties agreed that finalized portions of roadways through their properties are to be considered a county road. It will be maintained by the county.

Kevin and Rebecca Moes agreed to remove any personal property they had on the Devault-Salmon side of the road within 30 days.

Salmon and Devault also will not object to the dismissal of misdemeanor charges against Kevin and Rebeca Moes in two cases in Estill District Court.

Attorney Riley stated there is still a lawsuit pending in Estill Circuit Court. It involves the Southern Four Wheel Association and Estill County Land Company.

Sgt. Stuart Morris arrested **Tony Pearson** of Richmond on July 24 for a probation violation.

Dustin Willis, 34, of Thomas Road, Irvine was charged July 21 by Sheriff Chris Flynn for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (heroin).

The sheriff's department was executing a search warrant at Willis' residence when the sheriff located four individually folded pieces of foil inside a metal tin beneath Willis' pillow.

Anthony John Townsend, 46, of Pine Ridge, Kentucky was arrested July 21 by Kentucky State Police in Powell County on an Estill County warrant.

The warrant was obtained by Deputy Brad Smith following a single vehicle collision on January 14 on Furnace Junction Road.

Smith said the vehicle had been abandoned, and he was unable to locate any occupants.

Townsend was charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and third offense (methamphetamine).
