Early in the second quarter, Spivey would find the endzone again from 22 yards out and after another Morgan turnover, K. Day would rip off a 30 yard run and Spivey would find paydirt again for his third TD in the first half. On Estill's next possession, D. Bingham would get into the act with a beautiful 66 yard sprint that would lead to Day "making 'em pay" with a 9 yard TD run. A 27-0 lead would give the Halftime

Homecoming festivities a happier feel.

In the second half, the 'Neers would continue to smother Morgan County with a healthy dose of the ground game. Dylan Spivey would continue where he left off in the first half as he found the endzone two more times on his way to a 5 touchdown night. Estill County would see their record evened up at 4-4 (2-2 district).
