Pedestrians

So many pedestrians are being hit and killed on highways; especially in Lexington. But every driver and pedestrian should review the law on pedestrian guide lines in accordance with KRS 189.570.

The other night I was driving home from the middle school basketball game and a couple of people were walking on Highway 89. It was dark, they were wearing dark clothing and I did not see them immediately walking on the side of the road. It really shook me up coming so close to someone. We must remember that people walk more on 52 and 89 than usual. Many people walk on Sandhill Road also. With trick-or-treating coming up and more and more people walking nowadays we need to review rules for pedestrians.

General Guidance:

Rule 1. Pavements (including any path along the side of a road) should be used if provided. Avoid walking with your back to the traffic. Always walk facing oncoming traffic. If you have to step into the road, look both ways first. Always show care and consideration for others.

Rule 2. If there is no pavement, keep to the right-hand side of the road so that you can see oncoming traffic. You should take extra care and be prepared to walk in single file, especially on narrow roads or in poor light. Keep close to the side of the road. Cross the road well before

fore a sharp, right-hand bend so that oncoming traffic has a better chance of seeing you.

Rule 3. Help other road users to see you. Wear or carry something light-colored, bright or florescent in daylight conditions. When it is dark, use reflective materials such as armbands, sashes, jackets, coats, and footwear that can be seen by drivers using headlights up to three times as far away as non-reflective materials. Help yourself to be seen.

Rule 4. Young children should not be alone on the pavement or road. When taking children out, keep between them and traffic and hold their hands firmly. Strap very young children into strollers or use straps. Do not push the stroller into the road when checking to see if it is clear to cross, particularly from parked vehicles.

Rule 5. Organized walks. Large groups of people walking together should use a pavement if available. If one is not, they should keep to the left. Look-outs should be positioned at the front and back of the group and they should wear fluorescent clothing in daylight and reflective clothing at night. People on the outside of large groups should carry flashlights and wear reflective clothing.


Rule 6. Pedestrians must not be on roadways or slippery roads except in case of emergency.

Rule 7. Crossing the road. First find a safe place to cross and stop before you get to the curb. Look all around for traffic and listen. If traffic is coming, let it pass. Be sure you have plenty of time to cross, many times cars may be approaching faster than they look.

Rule 8. At a junction. When crossing the road, look out for traffic turning into the road, you have priority and they should give way to the pedestrian, but they do not always give way.

These are just a few of important safety rules for pedestrians. Drivers likewise should know and obey the law governing pedestrians.

Have a safe trick-or-treating, and be safe whether you are walking or driving.

The emptiness, the loneliness, the “desire for something more” is the “inheritance” that awaits those “who turn from evil and do good.”

As we began this article there is an undisputable fact, if we are now living, one day we will also die.

The question is: “What lies beyond the gates of Death?” Now at this present time some who claim that death brings about nothing but non existence. Is this true? Now again, I grant you this, no one knows very much about life after death. The Apostle Paul said it this way in **I Corinthians 13:12**: “*For now we see through a glass darkly but then face to face.*” In many places there are windows and doors that are produced with what is called obscure glass. This lets in shadows of light, but is not completely clear. This is the idea that Paul is trying to tell us about life after death. We have in the New Testament glimpses of the future. Again the apostle says concerning the future in **I Corinthians 2:9-10**: “*For it is written Isaiah 64:4, “The eye hath not seen, nor ear heard. Neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love Him. But God hath revealed them unto us by his spirit: for the spirit searcheth all things, yea the deep things of God.”* How then does the spirit make them known unto us? Notice **John 16:13**, “*Howbeit, when the spirit of truth is come. He will guide you into all truth, for he shall not speak of himself, but whatsoever he shall hear; that shall he speak, and he will show you things to come.*” So clearly, we see that the Bible is an insight into future things, we do not have full information about the future, but we have enough to give us a partial glimpse of the life beyond.

By this we know that no one is annihilated unto oblivion at death. In **Matthew 14**, here was Moses when physically died on Mt. Nebo in Moab (**Deuteronomy 23**) and God buried his body there. Also Elijah appeared on the mountain, and they were having a conversation concerning his disease by which he would accomplish in Jerusalem, **Luke 9:31**. How both these men had been earthly gone for over a thousand years, but were they annihilated after this life? Or were they fully alive? An acquaintance of ours said recently, “I have no idea about what lies after death, but I know a lot about what we are now. Immediately I thought I know why, simply because he did not believe in Jesus. Neither was he acquainted with the New Testament. There are many facts revealed to us about life beyond the grave. Heaven awaits a prepared people. **John 14:1-6** and an eternal judgment is awaiting everyone after our Lord returns. **Revelation 20:11-15** until our Lord returns a place of comfort called Paradise will be the resting place of the righteous. **Luke 23:43** and Paul also in **II Corinthians 12:4** got to visit this place temporarily.
