The crimes are being investigated by Detective Jesse Armstrong of the Kentucky State Police.

A grand jury has indicted an Estill County in a closet and on a bed in a home on Cardinal

It adds that he forced the same female to Ricky Snowden, now 43, of Estes Lane, have sexual intercourse with him at a neigh-- 2000.

He is also charged with subjecting that victim to sexual contact when she was under 12

He is accused of forcing a second victim home on Fitchburg Road while the victim was under 12 years of age.

Between 1994 - 1995, the indictment says that Snowden forced intercourse with that female again at a home on Driftwood Drive. Continued on Page 14


