

Girls Soccer Is Setting Milestones

Estill County Lady Engineers senior soccer player Emily Walton set a milestone on August 24, 2015 against Morgan County when she broke the all-time career scoring record for Estill County of 61 set by former player Taylor Adams.

Walton scored at 20:38 in the first quarter to break that record and she has continued to set milestones every since. The Estill senior has averaged 2.4 goals per game this season and has scored in every Lady Engineers game except one and is 4th in the state in individual scoring.

Just over a month later, it's not just Walton who is setting records but her teams as well. With the Lady Engineers' win on Thursday night over Powell County, they are 13-1-1 with their best start ever. Undeclared in the region (6 games) and district (4 games), the Lady Engineers soccer team will likely be the winningest team in Estill County history.

The entire team has done well and is second in the state in scoring with 6.3 points per game. Estill is currently tied for 4th in scoring margin, winning by an average of 4.8

per game. Estill shut out Powell County in an earlier meeting at Stanton, 10-0, but let the Lady Pirates slip in a goal early in the Thursday's game at Estill. But that's all Powell could do as the Lady Engineers totally dominated the rest of the game to win 8-1.

Kennedy Horn led Estill with 4 goals and the Lady Engineers got one each from Walton, Jady Rose, Lindsey Wood and Billie Brooks.

The Lady Engineers are led by the mother and son team of Candie McMaine and Andrew Hatton. This is

McMaine's 6th year coaching Estill and she has compiled a record of 61-42-6.

This is McMaine's 4th straight winning season. The Lady Engineers haven't won a region yet but came close last year, losing in a shootout to Perry County Central in the finals.

At senior night on Friday, Walton gave credit for her success for "having the best coaches I could ever ask for" and "having my parents at every game, cheering me on from the sidelines and being my #1 fans always!"

The Engineers are led by 11 seniors including goal tender Cody Boian.

Peyton Rose had two to lead in the win over Powell, and Dustin Abshear and Boone Tucker added one each.

Austin Witt was team leader against Jackson City, putting in three goals. He is also the season leader with 18 goals. Abshear, Rose and Tucker also scored against Jackson City.

Grand jury returns indictments

The indictment adds that he forced sex a third time with that female in February 1998 when she was under 16.

He allegedly forced a third victim to have sexual intercourse at a home on Driftwood Drive between 1994 - 1995.

The indictment states that Snowden subjected a fourth victim to sexual contact during 2008 and in the summer of 2008 on Dugans Lane. That alleged victim was under 12 years of age at the time.

The indictment charges Snowden with the incest of his sister in 1990. It adds that she was under 12 years of age when he had sex with her.

He was also indicted for incest in 1998 - 2000. The victim is also listed as his sister but was under 18 years of age at this time.

Two of the charges against Snowden are Class A felonies, each punishable by 20 to 50 years or life in prison if convicted. Five charges are Class B felonies, punishable by 10 to 20 years in prison. Three are Class C felonies and the punishment is five to ten years. And one is a Class D felony, which carries a punishment of one to five years in prison.

Fourteen others were indicted Friday by the Estill Grand Jury.

Charlotte Riddell, 46, of Pea Ridge Road was indicted on six counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument, second degree.

The indictment says between September 4-9, 2015, Riddell cashed six checks at a local grocery knowing the checks had been forged. The checks totalled \$430.

Deputy Sheriff Doc Morris investigated.

Ryan Brown, 33, of Geneva Ave., Irvine, was indicted on a single charge of theft by unlawful taking or disposition of a firearm. The indictment says he took a firearm belonging to Charlotte Brown on June 1, 2015.

Irvine Chief Brad Smith conducted the investigation.

Sandra Conrad, 51, of Sweet Lick Road, Irvine, was indicted on a single charge of wanton endangerment, first degree.

The indictment says she fired a shot from a revolver at Justin Chad Warner on August 9, 2015.

Randall D. Bingham, 35, of Picnic Loop, Irvine, was indicted for theft by unlawful taking or disposition.

The indictment says between July 1 and 22 of 2014, Bingham removed several items from South Fork Energy and pawned them at

Dollar Deals.

The investigation was conducted by Deputy Morris.

Danny Lee Abney, 26, of Stacy Lane and Ricky J. Westerfield II, 35, were named as co-defendants in an indictment. Both are charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, first offense, and drug paraphernalia.

The indictment says they had 65 grams of cocaine and five grams of heroin in their possession on June 17, 2015 which they intended to traffic.

Abney was also charged with failure to wear a seat belt.

Irvine Chief Brad Smith conducted the investigation. Carrie Estes, 33, of Dry Branch Road, Irvine, was indicted for second degree burglary. The indictment says she unlawfully entered the home of Dwayne Arvin on Sept. 14, 2015 with the intent to commit a crime.

Morris was the investigating deputy.

Emily Leach, 32, of Low Gap Road, Irvine, was indicted for receiving stolen property. Deputy Morris says she had a 4-wheeler in her possession on June 14, 2015 which had been reported stolen.

An indictment charges Homer Fred Rogers Jr., 36, of Sweet Lick Road, Irvine, with receiving stolen property under \$10,000.

Morris, the investigating deputy, said Rogers had a riding lawn mower in his possession on July 3, 2015 which had been reported stolen.

Jackie Goosey, 48, of Clear Creek Road, Irvine, was indicted for four counts of forgery, second degree.

The indictment states that between August 5-10, Goosey falsely made four checks to defraud Imogene Goosey and cashed them at two local businesses. The checks totalled \$837.32.

Morris was the investigating deputy.

William S. Addison, 40, of Lexington was named in a six count indictment related to a traffic stop on February 18, 2013 by KSP Trooper J. Carpenter.

The indictment charges Addison with theft of identify of another without consent, a felony. During the traffic stop, Addison allegedly used his cousin's information to avoid being detected.

Addison is also charged with operating on a suspended or revoked license, speeding 11 mph over limit, failure to produce insurance card, giving officer false name and address, and license to be in possession.

Aaron Portwood, 41, of Sandhill Road, Irvine, was indicted on two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree and first offense, possession of marijuana, and drug paraphernalia.

The indictment says that on July 22, 2015, Portwood had 1 grams methamphetamine, 12 oxycontin, 24 clonazepam, and eight alprazolam in his possession with the intent to traffic.

KSP Trooper Robinson conducted the investigation.

Jason T. Gay, 37, of Berea, was indicted in connection with his alleged escape from deputy sheriffs on June 12, 2015. Gay was indicted last month for the escape.

This indictment charges Gay with two counts of theft by unlawful taking (1988 Dodge pick-up truck and machete knife belonging to Tim Noland).

He was also indicted for being a first degree persistent felony offender. The indictment says he has been convicted previously of at least two prior felony offenses.

Irvine Chief Smith was the investigating officer.
