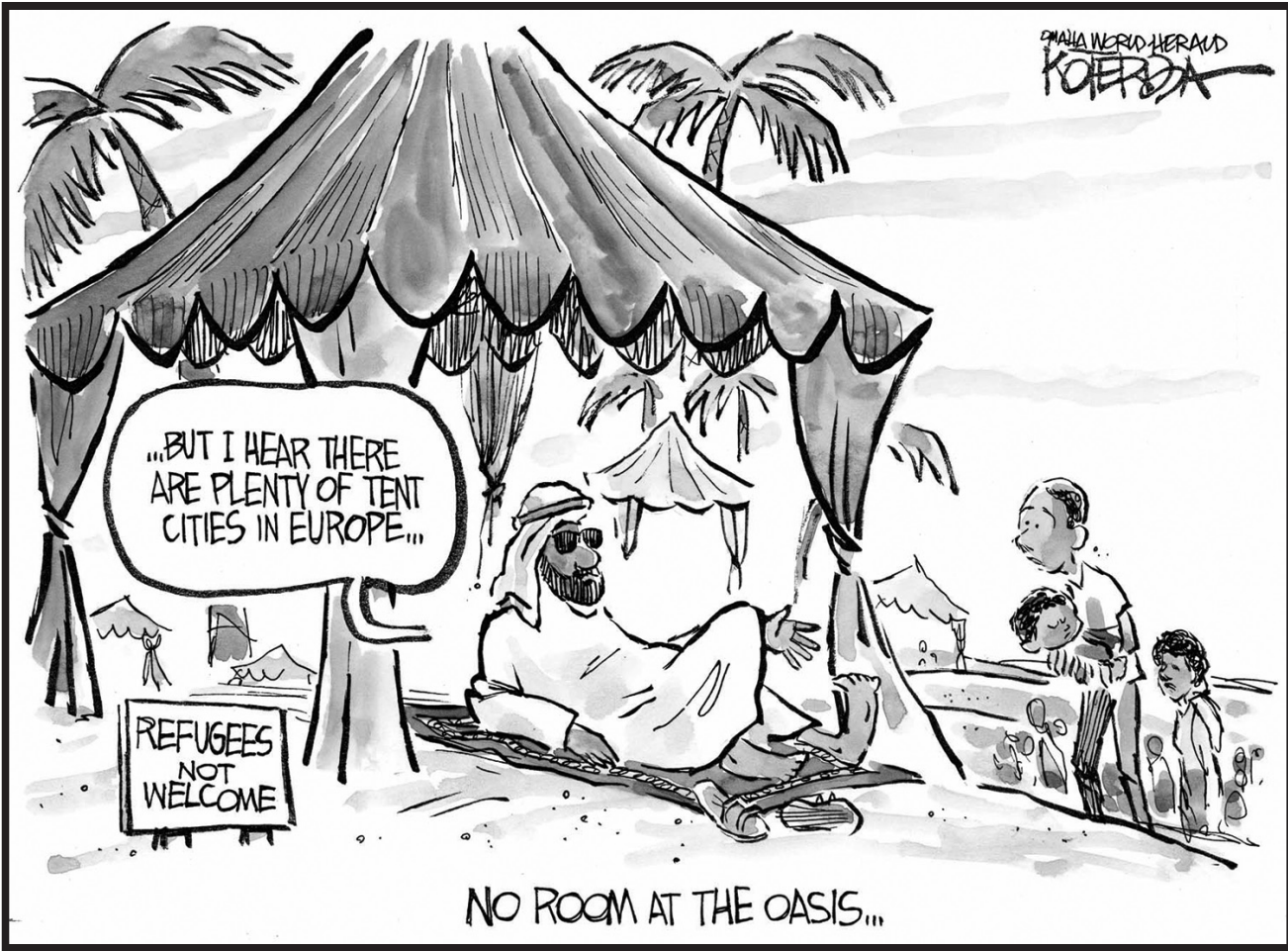

September Is CSEPP Exercise Month

September is a very busy month for the Estill County Emergency Management Agency (EMA)/Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP). Not only is September Preparedness Month, but it is also when we have our annual CSEPP Exercise.

This exercise not only involves Estill County, but all 10 CSEPP Counties and the Blue Grass Army Depot. The other counties included in CSEPP are: Madison County, Powell County, Jackson County, Clark County, Garrard County, Rockcastle County, Fayette County, Laurel County, and Jessamine County.

This annual exercise is how we evaluate our preparedness level to respond to a chemical emergency at the Blue Grass Army Depot. Federal Evaluators are brought in to observe how we would respond to a chemical emergency and then give us feedback on our strengths and weaknesses. Each county in the CSEPP Program is evaluated individually and then as a CSEPP Community. In an emergency that affects multiple counties it is essential that we work together to protect and meet the needs of all residents.

Many different entities must work together to respond to a chemical emergency. At the decontamination site every emergency response agency is present: Irvine and

Ravenna City Fire Depts., Estill County Fire Dept., Hargett Fire Dept., Estill County EMS, and Estill County Rescue Squad. At the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) you have representatives that report to keep communication open, help coordinate and support response agencies in the field, and answer questions for residents and media. Agencies represented at the EOC are: Fire, EMS, Rescue Squad, Health Dept., Hospital, Mass Care, Schools, Transportation, Public Works, Law Enforcement, and elected officials (City Mayors and County Judge Executive). You also have the EMA/CSEPP staff at the EOC that include: EMA/CSEPP Director, Public Information Officer, Financial Officers, Exercise/Training Officer, and Planning Officer. Marcum and Wallace Memorial Hospital staff are evaluated at how they treat mock patients showing signs and/or symptoms of chemical exposure. Each year a different school in Estill County is also evaluated at how they would respond to a chemical emergency. Staff and students demonstrate plans and procedures of Sheltering-In-Place or Evacuation.

All the First Responders and hospital staff spend many hours training to respond to emergencies and many are volunteers. The CSEP Program benefits Estill County in so many different ways. The training First Responders,

hospital staff and EOC staff receive is the best in the country and the amount of time and effort they put into their training shows. Federal Evaluators even took notice to our extensive training this year. The draft report states, "Estill County maintains an impressive position-specific continuing education program and refresher training for employees, responders and volunteers."

The staff at the Estill

County EMA/CSEPP office would like to thank everyone for their hard work and time that they commit to the CSEP Program making it such a great success and benefit to the residents of Estill County.
