

Engineers Run Over Frankfort, 49-39

The Estill County Engineers traveled to Frankfort last week and proved why they are one of the top rushing teams in the state by amassing 461 yards on the ground in a 49-39 victory.

This back and forth affair saw Estill trail at the end of one quarter but by halftime, the 'Neers were able to muster out a four point lead, 27-23.

A rarity for this game, neither team was able to cross the goal line in the third quarter and Estill would carry their lead into the fourth.

A 22-point Engineers outburst seemed to put this game out of reach, but Frankfort would not say die and scored 16 of their own.

In the end, Estill's ground game would be too much to handle and the Engineers would run their record to 2-1 with a 10-point victory.

Senior running back Kordel "make 'em pay" Day would shoulder much of the load on this night as he pounded out 240 yards rushing and struck pay dirt three times on the night.

Four other Engineers would gain much needed yards on this night as well, Dawson Bingham had 73 yards on just 9 rushes and seniors Michael Abner and Dylan Spivey would chip in with 53 yards each.

Spivey would score two TD's and Abner would get 1. Blake Franscisco would not be left out as he gained 33 yards and scored a TD as well.

Defense would not be the theme of this game, but several players had good nights.

Sophomore quarterback Logan Beckler would get into the action on the other side of the ball with his first "pick" of the year and Spivey would lead the team in tackles with 8, while adding a sack and fumble recovery. D.Hunt would also add a QB sack.

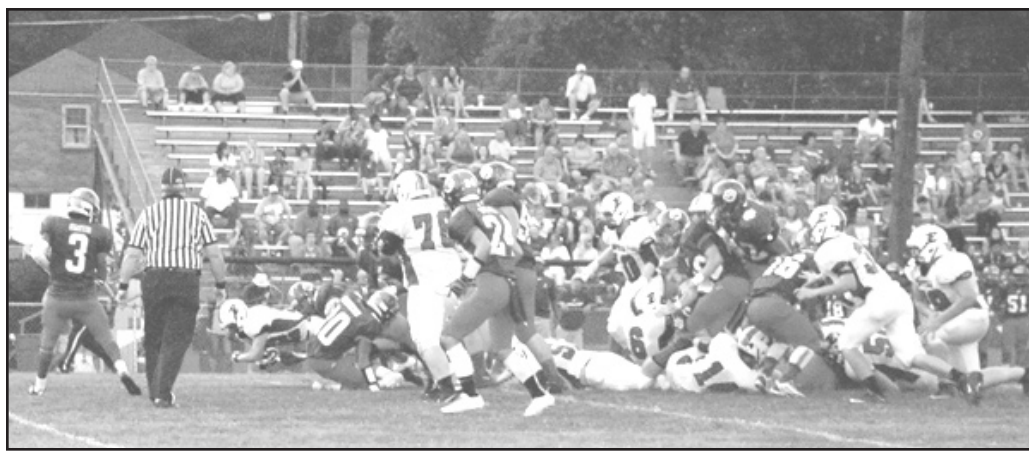
