On the game-winning drive, the Cats benefited from a pair of lucky bounces, Towles fumbled the snap on a sneak but was able to recover for first down. Two plays later, Louisiana was called for a face mask penalty that moved UK to the 24-yard line. Then the Raging' Cajuns were called for a holding penalty on a pass play that gave Kentucky a first down at the 14.

Two plays later Horton bounced off the right side to put the Cats back in front, 40-33, with what was the ultimate game winner. It felt like an escape; but all in all it was still a great win! GO CATS!

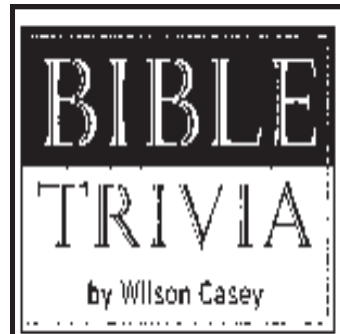

Is Satan having his day?

In **Revelation 12:12** it says: "Woe to the inhabitants of the earth and of the sea, for the devil is come down to you, having great wrath, because he knoweth that he has but a short time."

Coupled with the admonition of the apostle Paul in **II Timothy 3**, there should not be any doubt that Bible readers mind that this earth is fastly winding down toward the coming day of judgment. Never has so many things out of the ordinary taken place at such a rate before.

Our political leaders, along with our judges upon nearly every level are spitting in the face of God by the decisions they are making. The ruling from the supposedly Supreme Court is an insult to our God and creator.

My question today is: what is a Christian to do when faced with persecution from a law of man that is not supported by the Bible? **Romans 13:1-2** says: Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers for there is no power but of God. The powers that be are ordained of God. Then a warning, whosoever resisteth the ordinance of God and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. What laws then are we to support?

In the New Testament Law of Christ, there are several places where illustrations are given which say: "Only in the Lord," or within God's laws.

First, a Christian believer should only remarry another Christian should their mate pass away and if they wish to marry again. Point: here it clearly states, "only in the Lord."

2. In **Ephesians 6:1** children are taught to obey their parents. But again it says, "only in the Lord." So if a parent should teach a child any erroneous way that breaks God's law, the child should not obey that.

3. In **Philippians 2:29** and **Philippians 4:2** Paul admonished the church to receive his faithful brother in the Lord, and also tells his friends in the church to be of the same mind in the Lord.

4. In **Colossians 3:18** wives are taught to be submissive to their husbands "as it is fit in the Lord."

So again, what we are seeing in our state and nation related to same sex marriages is not a marriage at all because it flies in the face of plain scriptures, plus can never be conclusive to the anatomy, and can never produce any offspring.

5. By God's word we learn that all who may be engaged in their awful acts are devoid of God and are dining at the devil's table. **Romans 1:24-32** and if they don't repent, God will and many have given them up already.

6. Can these people repent and obey the Lord, and be forgiven? **Yes!** Paul tells us in **I Corinthians 1:9-11**. Here he says that some of the church at Corinth members were former practicing homosexuals but they were washed (baptized), they were sanctified (set apart) but justified (declared righteous) in the name (authority) of God. So there is hope for these people, **Only in the Lord**.
