Apple and Pear Rootstock

The Estill Extension Service will be taking orders for apple and pear rootstocks this month. If you want to propagate a favorite apple or pear, grafting is one of th easiest ways to preserve that cultivar. To graft, you will need scion wood (terminal branch segments from las year's growth collected at the end of February) and rootstock. If you do not know how to graft, come by th office for information or assistance.

We typically order Malling7 (55% of standard size and/or MM.111 (80% of standard) semi-dwarf appl rootstock and a pear rootstock. Please place your or der on or before January 22nd by calling 606-723-4557 The rootstocks usually arrive by the first of March. On ders must be prepaid by February 19th.

In addition, we will take orders for strawberry, black berry, blueberry, raspberry, asparagus, and Candy onion plants. Plant delivery will be in early April. If you ar interested or have questions, call our office at 723-455 Orders must be prepaid by March 18th.
