## Ravenna chaplain addresses council about community event in the park for children to meet first responders

Brother Bill Wesley thanked members of the Ravenna city council for being such a blessing to the community during the meeting on Monday night, December 12.  
Wesley said that ever since the appreciation banquet for police officers a couple of weeks ago that he has had several children express their interest in becoming a police officer or fireman when they grow up.  
Wesley asked the council if they would allow him to organize a community event in May at the Veteran's Memorial Park where children could come meet policemen, firemen, and EMT's and interact with them.

Wesley said the purpose of the event is to point the children in the right direction and enhance them to be somebody in the community.  
Police Chief Ken White said he thought it was a great idea because more often than not when he responds to a domestic call the kids go screaming in the opposite direction when they see him.  
Wesley went on to say that he would also like the EMT's to teach the children that attend that day basic CPR and he hopes that the National Guard will also participate and set up the obstacle course wall.  
"It's all about changing lives," stated Wesley.  
Fire Chief David Harvey asked the council's opinion on how to spend \$500 that

was part of a donation that was made by a factory in Berea. Harvey said that one of the stipulations to the donation was that \$500 was spent throughout the community, and he suggested purchasing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for residents in the city.  
He also said that a donation to the Toys for Tots campaign that is led by Chief Ken White was also a possibility.  
The council approved an ordinance pertaining to electrical inspection fees and then adjourned the meeting. The next council meeting will be held on January 9, 2017 at which time William (Pig) Van Cleve will be sworn in as a member of the city council.
