Faithful unto Death Linville Dunaway, Corinth Christian Church

Revelation 2: 8-11, "And unto the angel of the church in Smyrna write; These things saith the first and the last, which was dead, and is alive; I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty, (but thou art rich) and I know the blasphemy of them which say they are Jews, and are not, but are the synagogue of Satan. Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; He that overcometh shall not be hurt of the second death."

Faithful unto death is the call that we have from the Lord. Not faithful for a short time, but forever. This is what God demands of those who follow him. The church at Smyrna was facing persecu-

tion like Christians in other places were enduring. While it would not be easy, the Lord promised that those who were faithful unto death would receive a crown of life. We here in America don't really know, at least not yet, what real persecution is.

In other countries our brothers and sisters in Christ are facing it right now. Some break under the stress and go back on their faith, and others endure a painful death believing in the promise of God. I'm sure that more and more we will see such things here in America. Find it hard to believe? Look at how America is turning farther and farther away from God. We allow those of man made religions to come here and practice their faith while in the countries that they came from Christians are being slaughtered.

Because we don't see it firsthand many can't believe that such things are going on. Believe the truth these things are happening as many Christians are facing death for their faith. We here are told that in the name of "Religious Freedom" we are not to mention Jesus because atheists, Jews, Moslems, and other groups are offended by him. Jesus said that if they hated him they would also
