At the public meeting, Dave Retell, director of landfill operations for Advance Disposal, said the material was misrepresented when it was brought to the landfill.

"We will do whatever is necessary to minimize the threat." Retell then stated.

He also added that at that time, Advanced Disposal was submitting a working plan of remediation to present to the


The landfill is required by the notice of violation to comply with a Radiation Survey and Site Investigation (RSSI) by the Cabinet for Family and Health Services.

A landfill near Ashland also received a notice of violation the same day. The state says Green Valley Landfill accepted a low radioactive waste from Ohio between June 2015 and January 2016.

The radioactive waste was sent to both landfills by Advanced TENORM Services, LLC out of West Liberty, Ky.

The Energy and Environmental Cabinet sent a cease and desist order to Advanced TENORM Services, LLC on March 1.
