Some Things Men Are Not Doing by BOB CASEY, preacher **Cornerstone Church of Christ Bond Street at Camp Avenue in West Irvine**

Someone once said that "they could not be held responsible for things they did not say, or did not do, or hear." Now I grant you this, that in many instances this might be true, but in matters of eternal salvation these just will not work. Jesus said in **John 5:5**, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God, and they that hear shall live." This he said in reference to all who are dead in trespasses and sin. So in the following verse he reveals his authority to give eternal life unto all that will hear him.

So then, if this is true, just why are not all men now saved? I believe the answer is a simple one. Jesus says in **John 5:40**, "And ye will not come unto me, that ye might have life." Sadly, in verse 43 Jesus says: "I come in my father's name and ye received me not: if another shall come in his own name ye will receive." We see this evidence all around us. In Matthew 11:28-30 our Lord issues his worldwide invitation, "Come unto me all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." The last invitation is a blessed one recorded in Matthew 2:34, "Come ye blessed of my father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." But friend, if you have never taken time to hear him and come to him, you can never be in that number. God said in **Matthew 17:5**, "This is my beloved son, hear ye him." Both hearing and coming to Jesus are commands of obedience. Luke 6:46 Jesus says, "And why call ye me Lord, Lord, and do not the things I say." So then obedience in every form is commanded of every Christian. Obedience is necessary to eternal life. Hebrews 5:8-9, eternal life awaits only those who obey the Lord. Then in **Matthew 8:27** that even the winds and seas hear and obey His voice. Then sadly, a lot of religious men are listening to men rather than the Lord. The apostles said in Acts 5;29-32 "We ought to obey God rather than men."

Overdose is a medical emergency!

Call 9-1-1 immediately if you or someone you know have any of the symptoms listed below:

- Face is extremely pale and/or clammy to the touch
- Body is limp
- Fingernails or lips have a blue or purple color
- Person is vomiting or making gurgling noises
- He or she cannot be awakened from sleep or is unable to speak
- Breathing is very slow or stopped
- Heartbeat is very slow or stopped

Risk Factors for Opioid Overdose

- Mixing heroin or prescription opioids with alcohol, benzodiazepines or anti-depressants
- Taking opioids after a period of not using them can increase the risk of fatal overdose • If you have asthma or other breathing problems you are at higher risk for overdose
- People with liver or kidney problems or are HIV positive have increased risk of overdose
- A person who has had a non-fatal overdose in the past, has increased risk of fatal overdose
