On Monday night in Booneville, the Estill County Lady Engineers came one step closer to securing their 11th consecutive District Championship with a 11-1 victory over Owsley County. McKeely Muncie would use her arm and bat to make sure the Ladies would reach the title game as she turned in a 6 inning no-hit/14 strike-out performance on the mound and collected three hits including a double and triple at the plate. Hayley Puckett's two out single in the bottom of the fourth inning would plate two Estill

runners and break a 1-1 tie. The Lady Engineers would load the bases in the sixth and Sarah Wiseman would deliver with a 2 RBI single to extend the lead to 6-1. Estill would continue to add on runs and Zoe Deaton would end the game with a sharp single to left scoring Taylor Wiseman to put the Lady Engineers up by 10 and punch their ticket to the title game on Tuesday night.

Engineers Return To 14th Region Tourney

The Estill County Engineers baseball team is guaranteed a place in the 14th Region tournament to be held next week, following a 15-1 win over the Owsley County Owls on Monday night in Booneville.

The win sets up a rematch of Estill with the defending district champions, the Powell County Pirates who won 20-3 over the Lee County Bobcats in the nightcap.

The Engineers and the Pirates have played twice already this year with Estill coming out on top on May 3rd, 4-3, and 3-1 on May 13th. Those wins and two wins each over Lee County and Owsley County gave Estill the regular season title in the 56th District.

Last year, Estill was runner-up in the district to Powell; then lost 4-5 to Knott County Central in extra innings in their first game of the 14th Region competition.

Estill finished the regular season 19-14 with a 11-5 region record. The Engineers finished the regular season with a 6-0 district record and have added a win to each of those totals.

The Engineers finished off the regular season with a 12-2 win over Lee County, a 4-3 victory over Jackson County, an 8-0 shutout win

over Jackson County, and a 3-7 loss to Allen Central.

Estill faced off against Powell County on Tuesday night after press time with a game scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at Owsley County High School in Booneville.

The Engineers finished 19-14 last year in Coach Brian Crowe's first year as head coach of Estill.

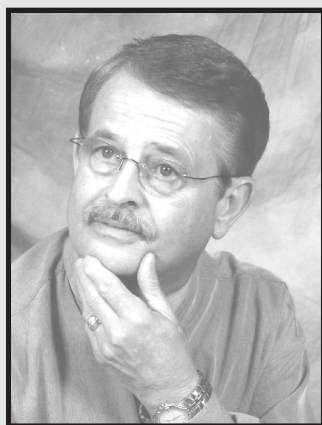
