In **John 14:27** our Lord says: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you, not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

My question is: How can a Christian who lives in a world full of trouble not be afraid?

I am not talking about personal fear, but fear for others. We are at this very present time living and seeing an all out assault from the devil upon the earth, foreign countries are either at war, or it seems poised upon engaging in such. But the thing that fears me most is the assault upon our children of today, not with war here at home, but with the drugs that the devil is using to destroy the minds and bodies of our youth. How can one who truly cares not be afraid for them?

All believers must wise up and take a strong stand today retaliating against this evil, by prayer, by faithfulness ourselves because our Lord will not hear the prayer of the disobedient!
