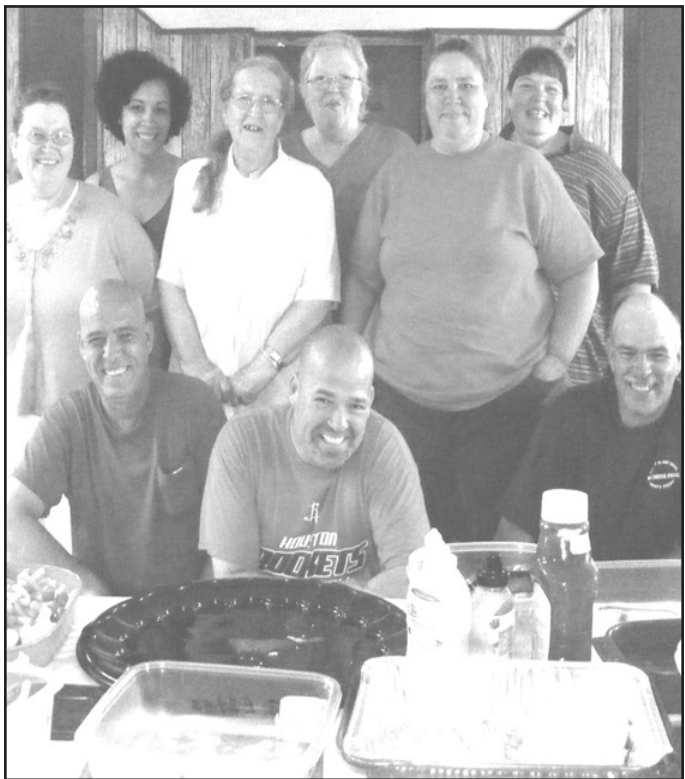

Caring About People

I have often said, "if anyone who attempts to preach does not care for the people; then he should not be preaching." It has been accurately said, "People never care how much you know, but it is how much you care that will get people to respond."

Our Lord was and still is the prime example of caring for people. In Matthew 4:23, "And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. And, in verse 24, it says that he went even into Syria and shared his compassion by healing all kinds of ailments of the body and mind. But today, men have not this power to implement to people as Jesus did or as the apostles did. But, we have access by faith into his power to help.

In the Book of James, 5:13-16, we are asked, "Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms. ¹⁴Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: ¹⁵And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. ¹⁶Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

So, by these instructions, we clearly see that there is present power to help all in time of distress of any kind. All Christians have this access to our Lord through a prayer of faith, but notice all those who may be involved must demonstrate their faith also.

So, our Lord asked the blind man in Matthew 9:27-31. Being blind, they asked for mercy, so they followed him into the house where he asked them, "Believe ye that I am able to do this?" So, he responded by touching their eyes, saying, "According to your faith be it unto you." And their eyes opened and they were healed.

So, even today, we have access to help from our Lord through the prayer of faith. But, consider this, where or who can the alien sinner pray to in times of distress? Let the Bible be noted, in John 9:35, "Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth." Our Lord cared for people and he still does, but he will not answer the requests of people who will not believe and obey him. Note, in 1 Peter 3:12, "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil."

Yes, we who are member of the Lord's church do care about you, but our care includes telling you the truth in all matters of faith. Please take time to read Proverbs 1:23-33. Visit with us soon.
