Local cop changes light and it goes viral on FB

A story of an Irvine police officer has gone viral on Facebook.

The story was posted by Lee Riley Freeman, a single mother living in Irvine on August 17 at 11:24 p.m.

She had gotten pulled over by "Officer" Adrian McKinney because her headlight was out.

She told McKinney that she had a replacement bulb but could not find anyone to get the old one out.

McKinney looked at the bulb and asked Freeman to pop her hood.

"He fought with the headlight 15-20 minutes, but he was handier than a pocket on a shirt for me," she stated.

"It was hot, muggy, and dark," she said. "He also ended up with burned fingers trying to help me. He didn't have to change

it for me. He could have written me a ticket, but he took an oath to protect and serve, and he did just that tonight."

After posting this on Facebook, it was shared on a Facebook site, "Love What Matters," which reposts positive stories about police officers.

Many of those reading Freeman's Facebook post noticed that McKinney was not just an officer. His rank is captain. They commented that captains do not usually do patrol work.

McKinney wrote in a Facebook post that he was not a real hero. He shared the story of "a real hero," an officer who held a teenager's hand who was a victim of an accident.

"Thank you, Officer McKinney!" Freeman said.

Billy Gross, 37, of Rose Street, Irvine was charged August 18 with possession of marijuana by Irvine Officer John Sturniolo.

The citation states that Gross was a passenger in a vehicle stopped for traffic. Sturniolo asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle. The officer stated that Gross became nervous. Sturniolo stated that K-9 would be deployed, and Gross admitted to having two marijuana cigarettes in his right front pocket.

• Christopher Tipton, 38, an Irvine homeless man, was charged with public intoxication, possession of drug paraphernalia, and trafficking in a controlled substance on August 18 by Officer Sturniolo.

Sturniolo said that Tipton was seen walking near Estill Avenue and River Drive just after 9 p.m. and caused some traffic concerns.

Sturniolo said a search turned up five syringes and a crushed aluminum can.

He added that Tipton sold a confidential informant working for the Irvine Police Department a suboxone strip for \$25.00.

Tipton allegedly told the officer he used the crushed can for the suboxone strips. He had \$10.00 which was seized by the Irvine Police Department.

• Two warrants of arrest were issued by Estill District Judge Wm. Leach and were served August 22 by Irvine Officer Sam Hensley on Charles Maness, 37, of Chestnut Stand Road, Irvine.

One warrant says that Maness failed to appear in Estill District Court to answer charges of operating on a suspended or revoked operators license and no registration receipt. Failure to produce an insurance card was dismissed.

The second warrant was issued because Maness allegedly failed to pay a fine of \$153.00 on charges of possession of a controlled substance second degree and first offense and drug paraphernalia buy/possess. He was found guilty of those charges on January 13, 2016.

Bail on this warrant was set at \$153.00.

• Zachary Schooler, 23, of Phyllis Ann Court, Irvine, was arrested August 19 by Officer Sturniolo on a bench warrant signed by Judge Leach.

The warrant states that Schooler failed to appear in court to show proof of West-care. He had been found guilty of fourth degree assault on March 16, 2016. No bail was set.

• A warrant was served August 17 by Irvine Officer Jeremy Hamm on Christopher Crowe, 26, of Dug Hill, Irvine.

Judge Leach signed the warrant because Crowe allegedly failed to appear in district court to be arraigned on a charge of possession of marijuana. Crowe was to be held without bail.

The same officer served a bench warrant from Madison County on Donald Fields, 45, of Sugar Hollow Road,

Irvine on August 20.

Madison District Judge C. Hardin signed the warrant because Fields failed to appear on charges of alcohol intoxication in a public place and contempt of court.

Judge Hardin set Fields' bail at \$250 cash.

• A Regis Road resident was arrested on drug possession charges August 18.

Deputy Russell Morris said he served a warrant on Tyler Neal, 25, while Neal was at the BP Station on Richmond Road.

No details on that warrant were available.

Morris was assisted at the scene by Irvine Officer John Sturniolo and its K-9 officer, Fritz. The deputy said the dog ran around the car and alerted on it.

The deputy stated that a bottle was found in the rear floorboard which contained hydrocodone, clonazepam, and meth.

Drug paraphernalia was also reportedly as syringe, razors, plastic bags, and a scale with white residue on it.

Neal was charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine and opiates, possession of a controlled substance, third and drug paraphernalia, buy/possess.

Neal was arraigned in Estill District Court on Monday.

• Lexington Metro Police arrested an Irvine man on a warrant August 11.

The warrant had been obtained by Captain Adrian McKinney. It charged

Jonathan F. Harrison, 31, of Broadway, Irvine with assault fourth degree and fleeing or evading police.

Harrison was arraigned Monday in Estill District Court.

• A Richmond man was arrested on drug related charges at a safety check point on Spout Springs Road on August 21.

The citation states that Quirvon D Merchant, 26, stopped before the check point and parked his van. He then got into another vehicle.

KSP Trooper J. Northern said that when that vehicle stopped at the checkpoint, Merchant was very nervous. When asked why he parked the van he was in, he replied it was junk.

A trooper ran Merchant's operator's license and said he had a suspended license. Merchant was asked to step out of the vehicle. That's when KSP said three unknown pills fell out of Merchant's pants and landed on the ground.

When asked if he had anymore pills, the citation says he first replied no. Then he pulled a clear plastic bag from his underpants which had several other pills in it.

Merchant reportedly told the officers the pills were lortab and gabapentin.

Merchant was charged with possession of a controlled substance, second degree, prescription controlled substance not in proper container and tampering with physical evidence.

Telecheck Will Be Adding New Questions for Deer, Elk Hunters

Starting this season, hunters will be asked to provide additional information about their harvested deer and elk during the telecheck process. All harvested deer and elk must be reported to the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources either by phone at 1-800-245-4263 or online telecheck at fw.ky.gov. Those checking an antlerless

male deer will now be asked to distinguish it as a male fawn – also known as a button buck – or as an adult that has shed its antlers.

"In most cases, a yearling buck in this state is going to have an antler spread of less than 11 inches," said Gabe Jenkins, deer program coordinator for Kentucky Fish and Wildlife. "We also liked 11 inches because it's an easy guide. A sheet of standard let-

ter-sized paper is 11 inches." Elk hunters also will be asked to enter the total number of antler points measuring 1 inch or longer.

Callers who do not have the required information will be asked to call back once they have it in order to complete the telecheck process and receive a confirmation number.

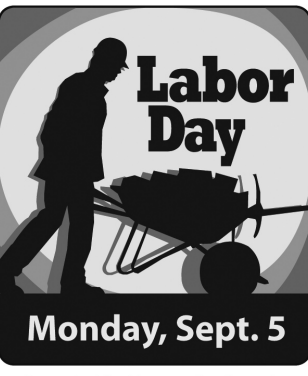
