Local Police Activity Report

Billy Gross, 37, of Rose Street, Irvine was charged August 18 with possession of marijuana by Irvine Officer John Sturniolo.

The citation states that Gross was a passenger in a vehicle stopped for traffic. Sturniolo asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle. The officer stated that Gross became nervous. Sturniolo stated that K-9 would be deployed, and Gross admitted to having two marijuana cigarettes in his right front pocket.

• Christopher Tipton, 38, an Irvine homeless man, was charged with public intoxication, possession of drug paraphernalia, and trafficking in a controlled substance on August 18 by Officer Sturniolo.

Sturniolo said that Tipton was seen walking near Estill Avenue and River Drive just after 9 p.m. and caused some traffic concerns.

Sturniolo said a search turned up five syringes and a crushed aluminum can.

He added that Tipton sold a confidential informant working for the Irvine Police Department a suboxone strip for \$25.00.

Tipton allegedly told the officer he used the crushed can for the suboxone strips. He had \$10.00 which was seized by the Irvine Police Department.


