World War II veterans like 96-year-old Ken Powell, of Lexington, who received five medals for heroic actions, is one of the brave. Ninety-two-year-old World War II veteran Nello Francis, of Garrett, saw the flag raising atop Iwo Jima and earned medals for his service. He's one of the brave.

Forty three veterans from across the Commonwealth with stories of bravery will fly to Washington, D.C., on August 27 to see memorials dedicated to them - free of charge - thanks to a sponsorship by Kentucky's Touch-
