

16 are indicted by Estill Grand Jury

Sgt. Sturniolo investigated. Earl Willis, 51, of Thomas Road, Irvine was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense. He allegedly sold two 30 mg. oxycodone to a confidential informant on July 15.

Kevin S. Abney, 39, of Dark Hollow Road, Irvine and Cornelius Vargas, 25, of Crooked Creek Road were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

Both were charged with robbery second degree, tampering with physical evidence, two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance (oxycodone) possession of marijuana; and possession of a handgun by convicted felon on July 21.

The indictment says the two men used physical force on a confidential informant, removed a police recording device, and sold five 30mg. oxycodone to the confidential in-

formant on July 21.

Abney was also charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree (11 klonopin), four counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree (23 grams of heroin, 710 grams of methamphetamine, 100 oxycodone and 7 hydrocodone), two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree (222 suboxone strips and 22 suboxone pills); trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree (3,666 xanax); trafficking in legend drugs, first offense (2 viagara); illegal possession of legend drug (ambien); drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (scales, pipes, and rolling papers); and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

Vargas was charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The indictment states that he had a long gun and shotgun in his possession.

Abney's parents were named as co-defendants in another indictment.

Ronnie Abney, 64, and Betty Abney, 62, of Dark Hollow Road, Irvine were indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (over 100 oxycotin) and trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree (130 xanax) on August 6.

Ronnie Abney was also charged with three counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree (possessing 1.5 oz. methamphetamine and 2-3 grams of heroin, and allegedly selling two percocet to a confidential informant); conspiracy to traffic in a controlled substance; two counts of possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine and heroin); trafficking in a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school; drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (pipes and plastic bags); wanton endanger-

ment first degree; and tampering with physical evidence.

The indictment states that Ronnie Abney forced a confidential informant to ingest drugs to conceal evidence.

Sgt. Sturniolo investigated the cases against Hall, the Abneys, Vargas, and Willis.

Brian Crim, 33 and his wife, Brandy Crim, 32, both of S. Irvine Road, were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

Both were charges with fleeing or evading police on foot on March 28 and criminal possession of a forged instrument.

The indictment says they possessed a check for \$600 which belonged to Sherry Yeager.

Brandy Crim was also charged with theft of mail matter. It says she possessed mail which belonged to Carolyn Alcorn.

Deputy Morris investigated the case.

Arrests made by KSP & local police

KSP Trooper Ty Robinson charged Brianna N. Turner, 22, of McKee on Sep. 23 with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (meth), possession of marijuana, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and public intoxication of a controlled substance.

Ravenna Chief Ken White served an outstanding warrant on Joshua Ledford, 36, of Poplar Street, Ravenna on Sept. 23.

During a search, the chief said he found a metal bottle in Ledford's jeans pocket. Chief White charged Ledford with possession of a controlled substance (meth).

Deputy Doc Morris served an arrest warrant Sept. 24 on Brandy Crim, 32, of N. Stacy Lane.

Following a search, he charged Crim with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine), drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and possession of marijuana.

Irvine Sgt. John Sturniolo charged Billy Metcalf, 49, of Irvine on Sept. 19 with operating on suspended op-

erator license, third offense. The citation states that an ATL (Attempt to Locate) was issued for Metcalf because of drug involvement.

Irvine Officer Brian Cloyd served a bench warrant on Robert A. Harvey, 25, of Broadway, Irvine on Oct. 1.

He was found guilty in Estill District Court of operating a vehicle under the influence. Leaving the scene of an accident and buy or possession of drug paraphernalia charges were merged.

District Judge William "Bo" Leach stated that Harvey could pay \$1,093 cash for failure to pay.

Irvine Officer Jason Conrad charged Wesley J. Edmonson on Sept. 17 with illegal possession of a legend drug. The citation states that Conrad found 11 capsules in a cigarette wrapper identified as 500 mg. penicillin.

Sgt. Sturniolo served a Clark County warrant Sept. 17 on Nathaniel Parks, 30, a homeless man from Winchester.

Gary Rogers, 50, homeless of Irvine, was arrested Sept. 19 by Officer Conrad

on charges of first and fourth degree assault.

The citation states that Rogers pushed his girlfriend into her mother, knocking her to the ground and injuring her leg. Then he allegedly struck the girlfriend in the face with pruning shears. She had a laceration to her head and facial swelling.

Jeffrey Wayne McCreary, 42, of Cardinal Court, was cited with Irvine's vicious dog ordinance Sept. 18 by Officer Conrad.

The citation stated that McCreary's four dogs entered a rear yard on Evergreen Court. They allegedly ran after kids and attacked a dog there.

Michael D. Agee, 33, of Cow Creek Road, Ravenna faces seven charges after a traffic stop Sept. 29 by KSP Trooper J. Lakes.

The citation states that Agee was clocked 76 mph on the Richmond Road while Lakes was conducting stationary radar.

Lakes was assisted at the scene by Trooper Breshear and Irvine Sgt. John Sturniolo and K-9, which alerted on the vehicle.

Agee was charged with speeding 21 mph over limit, obstructed vision and/or windshield, failure to produce insurance card, operating on suspended or revoked license, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine), operating a motor vehicle under the influence, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

His passenger, Ashlee Agee, was arrested on an outstanding warrant.

Michael Agee pleaded not guilty during his arraignment on Monday. He will return to district court for a preliminary hearing on Oct. 11.

Deputy Chris Coffey charged Aaron Stone, 19, of Billy Fork Road, Irvine on Sept. 28 with public intoxication, carrying a concealed deadly weapon, and receiving stolen property (firearm).

The citation states that the deputy was dispatched to McDonald's parking lot because the teen was passed out behind the wheel.

The citation states the deputy recovered a pistol in the driver side door.

The weapon was identified as the same pistol which had been stolen from Deputy Doc Morris.

Stone pleaded not-guilty during his arraignment on Sept. 29. A preliminary hearing in Estill District Court is scheduled for Oct. 4. Stone's bail was set at \$7,500 cash.

Zack Sewell, 32, of Webb Road, Irvine was arrested Sept. 30 at the library by Irvine Chief Brad Smith.

Sewell was charged with public intoxication, resisting arrest, and disorderly conduct

Jimmy Nieves, 45, of Turner Ave., Irvine was charged with assault fourth degree on Sept. 27 by Sgt. Sturniolo.

The citation states that Nieves was upset with his wife and daughter. He threw at the television and broke its screen. It adds he threw items around the residence causing minor damage.

According to the citation, Nieves took his wife's medication and threw it around the bedroom. He attempted to break the tv in the wife's

bedroom.

Lastly, the citation states that Nieves pushed his wife to the floor.

Timmy Lee Bishop, 24, of Jacqueline Ct., Irvine, was charged with reckless driving no registration receipt, operating a motor vehicle under the influence, license to be in possession and public intoxication on Sept. 29 by Officer Cloyd Lewis.

Three bench warrants from Estill District Court were also served on Bishop by Officer Lewis.

Judge Leach issued the warrants saying that Bishop had failed to appear in court on either of the cases.

One case charged Bishop with public intoxication, menacing, disorderly conduct, and possession of a controlled substance, second degree. The second case charges Bishop with harassment and terroristic threatening, third degree. The other charge was for second degree disorderly conduct.

No bail was set in either case.

Two airlifted from collision

A report by Deputy Chris Coffey states that Zachary Barnett was turning left from KY 82 onto Hudson Mill Road and turned in

front of a vehicle headed toward Irvine.

The driver was identified as Alexander Taulbee of Stanton. She and her seven year old passenger were airlifted to UK.

Both vehicles were severely damaged.

Passenger injured in wreck

A passenger was transported by ambulance to Marcum & Wallace Hospital following a rear-end collision on Richmond Road on Sept. 28.

Connie W. Estes of Grace Chapel Road, Irvine was a passenger in the vehicle which was driven by Jacob

Estes. He was not injured.

The other driver, Austin Hughes, of Stacy Lane, was also not injured. Deputy Chris Coffey reported that Hughes' vehicle struck the Estes vehicle in the rear.

Both vehicles sustained minor damages.

KSP confiscates 365 pot plants

The citation adds that Rose had a marijuana joint in his pocket. Three small marijuana plants were found growing near a barn on his property.

During a search of the residence, state police say they took some clothing into evidence which was worn by Rose in the camera pictures.

There were 362 plants in the marijuana plot being cultivated, according to state police.

Rose was charged with cultivating in marijuana (five plants or more), first offense, trafficking in marijuana (over five pounds), first offense, and possession of marijuana.

Rose was arraigned in Estill District Court on Sept. 27 where he entered a not-guilty plea. He is scheduled to return to court for a preliminary hearing on Oct. 11.
