The citation adds that Rose had a marijuana joint in his pocket. Three small marijuana plants were found growing near a barn on his property.

During a search of the residence, state police say they took some clothing into evidence which was worn by Rose in the camera pictures.

There were 362 plants in the marijuana plot being cultivated, according to state police.

Rose was charged with cultivating in marijuana (five plants or more), first offense, trafficking in marijuana (over five pounds), first offense, and possession of mari-

Rose was arraigned in Estill District Court on Sept. 27 where he entered a not-guilty plea. He is scheduled to return to court for a preliminary hearing on Oct. 11.
