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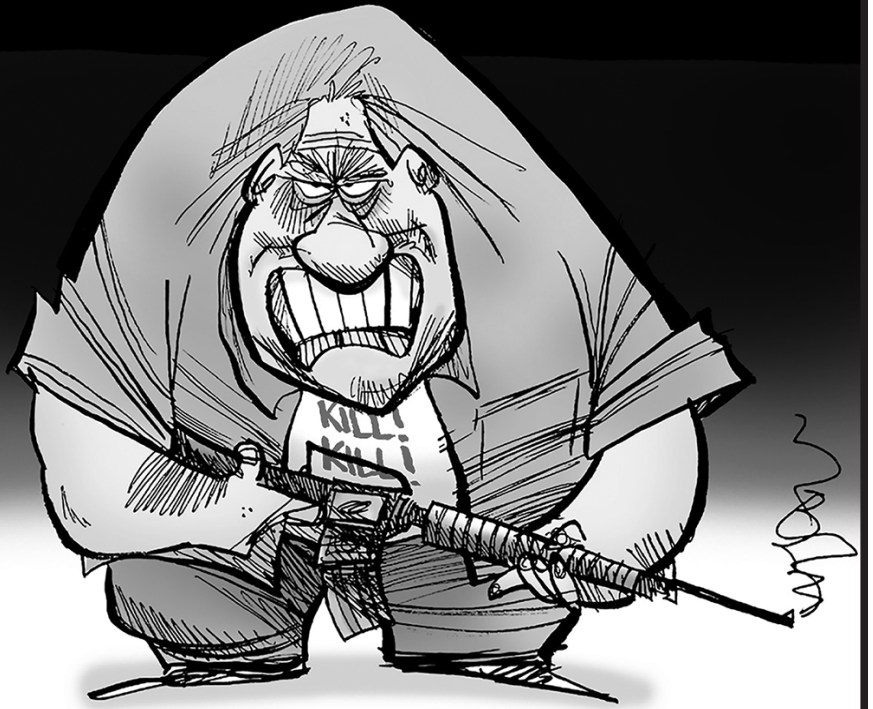

Trooper Robinson stated he advised Cole to put his arms behind his back to be handcuffed. He said Cole refused and had to be forcefully handcuffed.

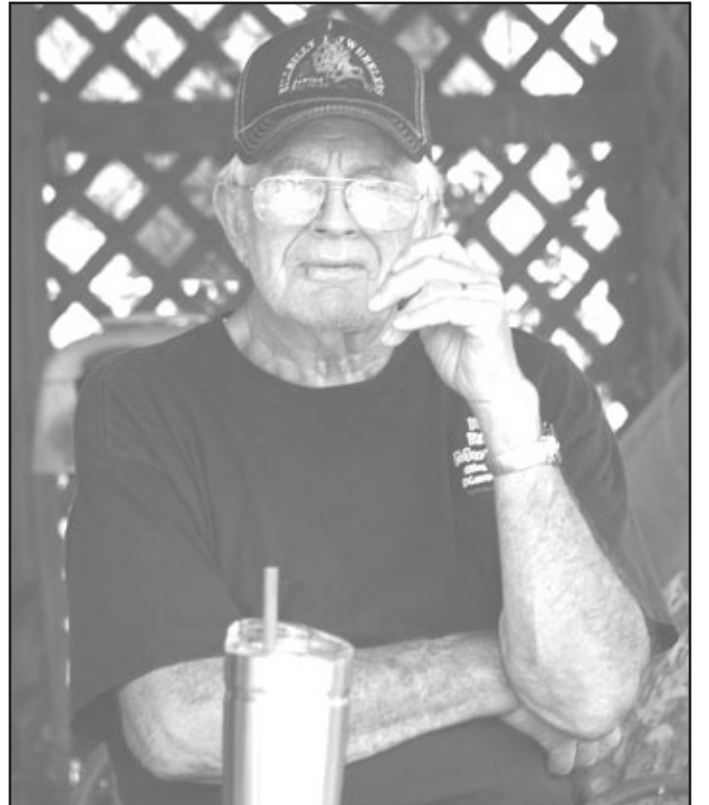
During the attempt to
