... that I shall do unto you?" <u>Matthew 20:32</u>. What a question that Jesus asked the blind men. What do you want from me is what he was asking. How about us, you and me, how would we answer him? These men wanted to be able to see. Whether they were born blind, or had gone blind, they wanted to see the world around them. Blindness is a terrible thing, and I have heard many, as well as myself, say that it would be one of the worst things to happen to anyone. There is more than one kind of blindness that effects mankind. The worst is spiritual blindness.

People can be blind to reason, unable to see the truth of the matter. People who are prejudiced are in this group. They judge on what they see, or hear, not on the facts. It may be because or race, where a person comes from, or one of several other factors. We may be judged by our family name, or some other thing of
