

Fiscal Court meets

The fiscal court receives rent from the Administrative Office of Courts (AOC) and Brinegar asked the fiscal court to make the repairs and AOC would reimburse them.

Animal Control Officer Tom Mullen presented a request to the fiscal court asking the way that other counties reimburse Estill. He said the board recommended the counties make an annual contribution rather than pay so much per animal.

"They are small counties and they have budget issues like everyone else," Taylor stated.

Mullen responded that animal shelters were required by law, and the counties cannot open one for the amounts the board recommended.

Estill hosts the regional animal shelter for Lee, Owsley, Wolfe, and Jackson counties.

The animal control board had also recommended microchipping animals which are adopted. Mullen said this mean raising the adoption fee from \$25 to \$40.

Attorney Davis said he had been notified the gate was back up on Mountain Springs Road.

A public hearing was held this month in which the court voted to keep maintaining the road. They also had told Kevin and Rebecca Moes to remove obstructions from the road, including equipment and livestock.

Davis said he filed a lawsuit Saturday morning against the Moes' couple. Judge Dean signed a temporary injunction also Saturday ordering the road to be kept open.

Deputy Doc Morris said he had served the Moes' couple with a copy of the court order on Sunday.

Mary (Jamie) Carroll and Ann Miller were appointed to terms on the library board.

Bids were opened for a CAD system for 911. The fiscal court asked Ronnie Riddell, director of Disaster and Emergency Services to look over the bids to see which is the lowest and meets specifications.

Riddell said the system will be paid for with a grant, if received.

The court agreed to advertise for gravel and a generator at the courthouse.

A special meeting will be called later this month to review the proposed budget. The fiscal court must approve one by June 1 and send it to the Department of Local Governments in Frankfort.

"When you get to the top, it's one of the best illustrations of where the bluegrass kisses the mountain," he stated.

He said you can see the campus of Eastern Kentucky University where the knobs meet the Cumberland Plateau.

Rogers said the preserve has a beauty clay mine, which is almost like snake oil. He said the clay was once sold as facial treatments, but it dried up too quickly.

Stickney said in the 70s, a lot of people came to Lily Mountain looking for UFOs.

"They saw something," Rogers stated.

Rogers thanked the fiscal

court for helping to build the parking lot, Carhartt employees, a group from UK, and Scouts.

"We need a campground," he added.

Funds can be donated to the Friends of Lily Mountain. The organization has a Facebook page.

Stickney said the preserve has recently received a \$5,000 grant, which will probably be used to renovate the old barn near the parking lot on Little Rock Road.

To reach Lily Mountain, turn left from Richmond Road onto Reges Road and go 2.8 miles, then make a right onto Dug Hill Road for 2.6 miles. Turn left onto Little Rock Road and go for .9 of a mile.

Deputy makes arrest for meth trafficking

An Estill County female was charged with trafficking in methamphetamine after she was arrested on an active warrant.

Deputy Daniel Smith said he served the warrant May 13 on Marsha Maggard, 33, of Rockaway Road, Irvine.

He stated that she asked if she could take her purse. He let her pack a few things off her kitchen table into her purse including a small cloth bag.

When they arrived at the jail, Smith said she asked if she could use the restroom and she needed her bag for her feminine products.

But Smith said the female deputy jailer before taking Maggard to the restroom checked the bag to make sure

it contained feminine products. He stated the deputy matron immediately handed the bag to him.

The bag contained a plastic box with a large rock and crystal like substance, a plastic baggie with the same type substance, and a piece of tin foil with the same substance, Smith stated.

He added the substance was field tested positive for methamphetamine.

The citation stated the substance was weighed on a scale. The total weight of the substance was 6 grams.

Maggard was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater than or equal to two grams methamphetamine).

Warrant is served on man for child support

A warrant was served on Danny Gerold Smith, 48, of McKee Road, Irvine by Trooper Austin Brashear.

The warrant charges Smith with flagrant non-support. Smith was ordered to pay child support in 2003.

The warrant was obtained

last year, stating that Smith had not made a payment since May 5, 2015.

As of May 11, 2016, Smith was reportedly in arrears of \$45,855.00.

Smith's bail was set at \$11,000 cash, which will be applied to his bond.
