Maybe you heard about the three mice that were sitting around boasting about how tough they were.

The second mouse pulled a morsel from his pocket, chewed it up, swallows, and said with a grin: "D-Con. It's my favorite snack."

The third mouse gets up and starts to leave when the others ask where he's going.

"Where do you think I'm going?" he responded. "It's time for me to go home and chase the cat."

The bravest people I've ever met have been Christians who have placed their

trust wholly in the Lord. I've had the privilege to meet missionaries who fearlessly serve in some of the most dangerous places in the world. I work with folks who I'm convinced would be willing to attack the gates of hell with squirt guns. They have learned that the Lord is altogether trustworthy, just as Joshua learned back in Old Testament days.

You might recall that, after Moses died, God commissioned Joshua to lead His people into the Promised Land. Opposing armies would try to stand in the way, but Joshua, a man of great faith, didn't flinch in the face of adversity. He did just as God had commanded, strengthened by His words:

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).

The Bible is so chockfull of encouragement for believers that it's little wonder they serve without hesitation. The Apostle Paul, that great missionary of the early church, gave us the secret of his incredible courage: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13).

It's funny how we as people can be frightened of so many things unnecessarily. One of my friends passed

along a joke recently about a man who stumbled into the police station with a black eye. He said he had heard a noise in his backyard and he went to investigate. The next thing he knew, he was hit in the eye and knocked out cold.

An officer who was sent to investigate came back with a black eye of his own. His captain asked him if he had been attacked by the same person.

"No," the officer replied. "I stepped on the same rake."

Sometimes, our greatest fears turn out to be entirely unwarranted. And, even when they are warranted, we need to remember we have a God who loves us and who wants the best for us:

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope" (Jeremiah 29:11).

I wouldn't advise doing pushups on a mousetrap, or eating D-Con, or event chasing a cat. But, if you do face difficult circumstances, you have a God who is willing to help you through them.




