## Salem Baptist Church is collection point for Operation Christmas Child

Several area locations, including Salem Baptist Church, 4470 Spout Springs Road in Irvine, will serve as collection sites this year for the Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child—the world's largest Christmas project of its kind.

As Thanksgiving Day approaches, Irvine families are expressing their gratitude by giving back. Residents are filling shoeboxes with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items to send to children in need around the world. For many of these children, it will be the first gift they have ever received.

During Operation Christ-

mas Child's National Collection Week Nov. 12-19, local residents will collect shoebox gifts at drop-off locations serving Irvine participants. The Samaritan's Purse project, partnering with churches worldwide, will deliver these gifts to children affected by war, disease, disaster, poverty and famine. The Kentucky River Area Team volunteers hope to collect more than 7,061 gifts during the week.

"We believe these simple gifts have the ability to send a tangible message of hope to children facing difficult circumstances," said Regional Director Todd Edwards. "It is exciting to see the Irvine community come

together to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with millions of boys and girls around the world."

Irvine residents are not alone in their effort to help children around the world. More than 150,000 U.S. volunteers including families, churches and other groups are joining forces to contribute to the largest Christmas project of its kind. In 2018, Samaritan's Purse hopes to collect enough Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts to reach 11 million children.

Three bench warrants from Estill District Court and one from Estill Circuit Court were also served on Sparks.

Judge Leach set bail on the two of the warrants at \$6,308.55 and one at \$85.00. There was no bail set on the third warrant.

Also, Judge Dean did not set a bail for Sparks on the circuit court warrant.

• **Gerald B. Johnson**, 30, of Scott Court, Irvine faces nine charges following a traffic stop on Nov. 7 by Officer Colton Lewis.

Officer Lewis said the vehicle sped up Chestnut Stand Mt. when he activated his blue lights and siren. It traveled in excess of 60 mph in a 35 mph zone.

Lewis added the Toyota eventually wrecked on Chestnut Stand Mt. He added the driver refused to obey commands to leave the vehicle and show him his hands. The driver was removed from the vehicle and escorted to the ground.

Johnson was charged with speeding 26 mph or greater, reckless driving, rear license not illuminated, operating a motor vehicle under the influence, wanton endangerment, first degree, fleeing or evading police, first degree, resisting arrest, operating on suspended or revoked license, and failure of non-owner to maintain required insurance.

Ravenna Police Chief and IPD Sgt. John Sturmiolo assisted with the arrest.

• **Faye LaFountain**, 33, of Laurel Street was arrested November 8 by Officer Jason Conrad.

The officer said he was dispatched to Laurel Street in reference to a possible fight in progress. When he arrived at the scene on Elizabeth Street, he said that LaFountain was standing in the middle of the roadway, waving a large crescent wrench in the air like she was going to hit someone.

The Elizabeth Street resident told Officer Conrad that LaFountain had been on their property trying to start a fight with the resident's daughter.

LaFountain was charged with alcohol intoxication in a public place, menacing, and disorderly conduct, first degree.

• Two Estill District Court bench warrants were served Nov. 8 on **Todd Childers**, 52, of Geneva Avenue, Irvine.

One warrant says that Childers was found guilty of no registration plates and failure of owner to maintain required insurance on Feb. 2, 2018.

The warrant says he failed to pay the fine. Judge Leach set his bail at \$228.00 cash.

The second warrant says that Childers has failed to appear in court on charges of operating on suspended or revoked license and no registration fee.

No bail was set in this case.
